Dana Kinsey 15 (Respondent), requested reconsideration of the Presiding Officer's Order issued on October 21, 16 2020, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) in this matter. 17 The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 18 WAC. 19 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 20 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioner Russell Lehman. 21 Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader 22 representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer, representing PDC 23 Staff, and Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator 2, and Respondent Dana Kinsey 24 appearing on her own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's 25 Proclamation 20-28 et seq. and recorded. 26

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated January 28, 2021, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator 2;
- 2. Signed Statement of Understanding, PDC Case 22114, received August 11, 2017;
- 3. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, PDC Case 76878, served September 23, 2020, (amended and original);
- 4. C-1 and F-1 reports, PDC Case 76878, filed by Respondent on September 23, 2020;
- 5. Respondent emails and PDC responses, PDC Case 76878, October 25, 2020, to October 28, 2020;
- 6. PDC email and Initial Order Imposing Fine, entered November 25, 2020;
- 7. Respondent's email request for reconsideration, dated November 29, 2020, and the PDC's response dated December 1, 2020;
- 8. Reconsideration Enforcement Hearing Notice, served January 11, 2021;
- 9. Respondent email dated January 19, 2021, confirming phone participation in the Reconsideration Hearing.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involved Respondent's request that the Commission reconsider a Final Order issued on November 25, 2020, resulting from an Initial Hearing on October 21, 2020, regarding Dana Kinsey, a candidate for San Juan County Charter Review Commissioner, Residency District 2, during election year 2020. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 and .700 for failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) and Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 1, 2020, as required. Respondent has one prior violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to file a F-1 Report in 2017, disclosing financial activity for 2016, which was resolved via a Statement of Understanding (PDC Case 22114). Due

to the prior violation, the Presiding Officer imposed a civil penalty of \$500.

The basis of Respondent's Request for Reconsideration was that she was unaware of the repeated notices sent to her by the PDC prior to the hearing and, in her November 29, 2020, response she indicated the PDC filing system was "difficult and cumbersome" to use.

- 1. PDC staff attempted to contact the Respondent by sending three emails on May 28, June 4, and June 9, 2020, reminding her of her responsibility to file C-1 and F-1 reports. These reports were sent to the contact emails provided by filers on their PDC reports. Starting June 15, 2020, PDC staff also began contacting candidates by phone regarding their missing reports.
- 2. On July 17, 2020, PDC staff sent warning letters by electronic and U.S. mail to candidates informing them of how to avoid potential enforcement and fines. The warning letters were mailed to the addresses provided by filers on their PDC reports.
- 3. A Hearing Notice was mailed to the Respondent to her address of record (P.O. Box 218, Eastsound, WA 98245) on September 22, 2020, for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held October 21, 2020.
- 4. A Hearing Notice was sent to the Respondent's email address (dnkinsey@gmail.com) on September 23, 2020, and offered an opportunity to avoid an enforcement hearing by signing a Statement of Understanding, filing the missing reports, and paying a \$100 civil penalty (per report) no later than October 15, 2020.

1 **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW** 2 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 3 42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the 4 Administrative procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC. 5 III. **ORDER** 6 7 As a result of Respondent's efforts to contact PDC staff after the hearing and the denial 8 of review in accordance with WAC 390-37-144(4), the Request for Reconsideration is 9 GRANTED. This Order on Reconsideration will be the Final Order. The Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and the \$500 civil penalty assessed at the October 21, 2020, Initial Hearing 10 are AFFIRMED. 11 12 1. The \$500 civil penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of the Order. 13 14 2.
