Dear John Weymer and Matt Nagle:

Enclosed is a copy of the Public Disclosure Commission's Final Order Imposing Fine that was entered in the above-referenced case concerning the Tacoma Weekly. Also enclosed is a copy of the Stipulation as to Facts, Violations and Penalty that was accepted by the Commission.

At its September 23, 2021 meeting, the Commission found the Tacoma Weekly in violation of RCW 42.17A.480 and assessed a total civil penalty of \$15,000, of which \$7,500 is suspended on the following conditions: (1) the Tacoma Weekly is not found to have committed any further violations of RCW 42.17A or WAC 390, as detailed in the Stipulation, within four years of the date of the Commission's Final Order; and (2) the Respondent pays the non-suspended portion of the penalty (\$7,500) within thirty days from the date of the final order.

In the event the Tacoma Weekly fails to meet any of the above terms of this order, the entire \$15,000 penalty will become immediately due without any further intervention of the Commission. 16	I. INTRODUC	CTION	
17	This matter was heard remotely by the Washin	gton State Public Disclosure Commission	
18	(PDC, Commission) on September 23, 2021, by audio	o and online streaming. The hearing was	
19	held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.		
20	Commissioners present both telephonically ar	nd online were Fred Jarrett, Commission	
21	Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vi	ce-Chair; and Commissioners William	
22	Downing, and Alan Hayward. Also present both to	elephonically and online were Assistant	
23	Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission; Assistant Attorney General		
24	Chad Standifer representing PDC staff; and Alice Fiman, Compliance Officer, for PDC Staff.

II. STIPULATION

The parties jointly submitted a signed Stipulation as to Facts, Violations, and Penalty (Stipulation). Mr. Standifer presented the Stipulation, reviewed the aggravating and mitigating factors, summarized the proposed penalties, and asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation. Mr. Weymer provided testimony on behalf of the Respondent, answered questions, and confirmed the information provided by Mr. Standifer. The Respondent took responsibility and asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation. The Commission voted 4-0 to accept the Stipulation as submitted.

III. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Tacoma Weekly is a community newspaper published by Pierce County Community Newspaper Group. It became the Tacoma Weekly in 1994 and is distributed free to businesses and public spaces in the Tacoma area.
- 2. On August 5, 2020, the Respondent sent an email to a distribution list soliciting an offer to purchase advertising in the Tacoma Weekly. The email solicitation included the subject line: "Let's Get You Elected," and noted that the August 2020, primary election was just conducted the previous day. It further stated the advertising was limited to only four candidates, and included an information sheet listing the items included and the cost.
- 3. The Respondent's solicitation included: (1) 12 quarter-page print ads; (2) two full page ads; (3) four front page ads; (4) one "maga block" ad for 12 weeks; (5) four 8 ½ x 11 inserts; (6) a Tacoma Weekly editorial; (7) one cover story; and (8) a Tacoma Weekly endorsement of

the candidate. The cost of this offer was \$2,500.

- 4. PDC staff queried the contributions and expenditures database and found two 2020 candidates had reported a purchase of a Tacoma Weekly advertising package: Javier Figueroa, current Mayor of the City of Lakewood, and Jason Whalen, Deputy Mayor of the City of Lakewood. Both Mr. Figueroa and Mr. Whalen were candidates seeking the office of Pierce County Council.
- 5. Mr. Figueroa signed a Statement of Understanding acknowledging violations of RCW 42.17A.320 by failing to disclose the required sponsor identification on paid political advertising sponsored by the Campaign that ran in the Tacoma Weekly. Mr. Figueroa paid a \$150 civil penalty resolving his failure to include the required sponsor identification in a Tacoma Weekly cover story, published on August 18, 2020, about his 2020 Pierce County Council candidacy. The headline to the story states: "Javier Figueroa Bringing an Independent Vote to Pierce County Council."
- 6. Mr. Whalen signed a Statement of Understanding acknowledging violations of RCW 42.17A.320 by failing to disclose the required sponsor identification on paid political advertising sponsored by his Campaign that ran in the Tacoma Weekly. Mr. Whalen paid a \$150 civil penalty resolving his failure to include the required sponsor identification in a Tacoma Weekly cover story, published on September 2, 2020, about his 2020 Pierce County Council candidacy. The headline to the story stated: "Jason Whalen: A Work Together Approach." A paid for political ad featuring Mr. Whalen, also published in the September 2, 2020, Tacoma Weekly includes the following language: "A community leader committed to working together to deliver for us."
- 7. The Respondent also sold an advertising package to Dr. Elizabeth Kreiselmaier, a candidate for U.S. Representative in the 6th Congressional District in 2020. As noted for the two candidates in sections 5 and 6 above, the Tacoma Weekly advertisements for Dr. Kreiselmaier consisted of the same advertisements including the cover story. The headline to

1	the story was: "Elizabeth Kreiselmaier 'Mom on a Mission to Clean Up the House." A paid for
2	political ad, also published in the same edition of the Tacoma Weekly, included the following
3	tagline: "A Mom on A Mission To Clean Up The House."
4	8. The October 7-13, 2020, edition of the Tacoma Weekly included an article for
5	Dr. Kreiselmaier entitled: "Smashing the glass ceiling in the 6 th Congressional District," which
6	was about Dr. Kreiselmaier. The article noted it was a paid advertisement that included the
7	sponsor identification indicating the Dr. Kreiselmaier's campaign was responsible for the
8	advertisement.
9	9. On October 16, 2020, Matt Nagle, Managing Editor for the Respondent, stated
10	that "an uncorrected version of our sales promotion flyer was attached to email sent to select
11	candidates. We corrected our mistake immediately and re-sent our email to these candidates."
12	He further stated that the corrected solicitation included 12 quarter page ads, two full page ads,
13	four front page ads, one block ad for 12 weeks, four "insertions of your flyer" limited to $8 \frac{1}{2} x$
14	11, one "Advertorial" ad, and a meeting with Tacoma Weekly editorial staff.
15	
16	IV. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
17	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A
18	RCW, the state campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative
19	Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
20	2. Based on the facts set forth above and the agreed stipulation of the parties, the
21	Respondent, Tacoma Weekly, violated RCW 42.17A.480 by soliciting money from three
22	candidates seeking public office in 2020, as consideration for an endorsement, article, or other
23	communication from the Respondent promoting those three candidates in their news publication.

25	V. ORDER
26	Based upon its Findings of Fact, the stipulated Findings of Fact, and its Conclusions of

1	Law, the Commission accepts the agreed Stipulation of the parties and orders that:	
2		
3	1. The Respondent pay a total civil penalty of \$15,000, with \$7,500 suspended on	
4	the following conditions:	
5		
6	a. Respondent is not found to have committed any further violations of	
7	Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC, within four years of the date of	
8	the Final Order in this matter. The suspended penalty shall not be	
9	assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or	
10	error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a	
11	technical correction.	
12		
13	b. The Respondent is in compliance with all reporting requirements.	
14	c. The non-suspended portion of the penalty (\$7,500) is paid by the	
15	Respondent within 30 days of the date of the Final Order in this matter.	
16	If the Respondent fails to make timely payment of the non-suspended	
17	portion of the penalty, the \$7,500 suspended portion of the \$15,000 total	
18	civil penalty shall immediately become due without further action by the	
19	Commission.
