of April 15, 2020, on April 22, 2020, April 29, 2020, and May 5, 2020.

- 5. From July 27 through October 7, 2020, PDC staff also made telephone calls to elected and appointed officials, and to representatives in the jurisdictions in which they serve, reminding them of their missed obligation to file the F-1 report covering calendar year 2019 that was due April 15, 2020;
- 6. On August 4, 2020, PDC staff received an email from Mr. Burkett's jurisdiction with a new phone number to contact him. On August 20, 2020, the PDC attempted to call the number but no voicemail was set up so staff was unable to leave a voicemail message.
- 7. On September 22, 2020, PDC staff sent a warning letter to Mr. Burkett concerning the missing F-1 report to the address provided to the PDC on the last F-1 report he filed on August 4, 2015.
- 8. Between December 8, 2020, and December 18, 2020, PDC staff was able to communicate by phone and email with Respondent's spouse regarding the F-1 requirements, prior violations, and penalties owed. Ms. Burkett offered to facilitate obtaining the reports and penalties owed. She also gave the PDC her own email address for future correspondence.
- 8. On February 12, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent by electronic mail with a hearing notice for a February 25, 2021, Adjudicative Proceeding before the full Public Disclosure Commission concerning the failure to file the F-1 reports.
 - 9. Prior violations of RCW 42.17A.700:
 - a) First Violation, PDC Case No. 16-242:
 - The Respondent failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2014, which was due no later than April 15, 2015.
 - On August 21, 2015, an Order Imposing Fine was entered imposing a civil penalty of \$100.
 - To date the Respondent has not paid the \$100 civil penalty.
 - b) Second Violation, PDC Case No. 10036:
 - The Respondent failed to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2015, which was due no later than April 15, 2016.

1	• On January 20, 2017, a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief	
2 3	Enforcement Hearing) was held at which the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$250 civil penalty for failing to file an F-1 report.	
4	 To date the Respondent has not paid the outstanding \$250 civil penalty 	
5	for PDC Case No. 10055 or filed the required F-1 report.	
6	c) Third Violation, PDC Case No. 22221:	
7	• The Respondent failed to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2016, which was due no later than April 17, 2017.	
8	• On August 23, 2017, a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement	
9	Hearing) was held at which the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty for failing to file an	
10	F-1 report that was due no later than April 17, 2017.	
11	 To date the Respondent has not paid the outstanding \$1,000 civil penalty for PDC Case No. 22221 or filed the required F-1 report. 	
12	d) Fourth Violation, PDC Case No. 38794:	
13 14	• The Respondent failed to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2017 which was due no later than April 16, 2018.	
15 16	• On October 25, 2018, an Adjudicative Proceeding(Enforcement Hearing) was held before the full Commission at which the Respondent was found in windtien of BCW 42.17A 700 and account a \$500 givil penalty for	
17	in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$500 civil penalty for failing to file an F-1 report that was due no later than April 16, 2018.	
18	 To date the Respondent has not paid the outstanding \$500 civil penalty 	
19	for PDC Case No. 38864 or filed the required F-1 report.	
20	10. Staff recommended at the February 25, 2021, hearing a civil penalty of \$1,000	
21	pursuant to the penalty schedule in WAC 390-37-182.

23	III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW	
24	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A	
25	RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative	
26	Te ii, iie saac campaign iniance and disclosure law, Chapter 37.03 ice ii, iie Administrative	

1	Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
2	2. Based on the above Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and hearing testimony, the
3	Commission concludes:
4	a. William (Beau) Burkett violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file F-1
5	financial reports for the years 2018 and 2019.
6	
7	IV. ORDER
8	Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that:
9	
10	1. Respondent William (Beau) Burkett is assessed a total civil penalty of \$1,000
11	which shall be paid within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
12	2. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2018 and 2019 shall be filed within
13	30 days of the date of this Order. If the Respondent fails to comply with the filing
14	of the F-1 reports or fails to make timely payment of the civil penalties, PDC staff
15	may sent the amounts due for collection without further action by the
16	Commission.
