Commission Staff 15 requested a full Commission hearing of this matter due to the Respondent's repeated violations. 16 The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 17 WAC. 18 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 19 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; Commissioner Bill Downing, and 20 Commissioner Russell Lehman. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 21 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 22 Chad Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance 23 Coordinator. Respondent Joshua Quantrell did not appear on his own behalf. The proceeding 24 was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 et seq. and recorded. 25 The Commissioners had before them the following materials: 26

- Case memorandum dated March 25, 2021, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Hearing Notice sent to Respondent on March 11, 2021, for Adjudicative Proceedings on March 25, 2021;
- 3. F-1 Report covering calendar year 2016 and 2017, filed August 22, 2017;
- 4. PDC Case 38893 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order Imposing Fine dated October 5, 2018.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves alleged repeat violations of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) no later than April 15, 2019, and April 15, 2020, for calendar years 2018 and 2019 respectively. The case is being heard pursuant to RCW 34.05.482(1)(c), and WAC 390-37-143(4-5) which require review by the full Commission.

- 1. Joshua Quantrell has served as Parks and Recreation Commissioner for Klickitat Reservation District for the term January 1, 2019, to the present.
- 2. In March and April of 2019, PDC staff emailed five reminders to the Respondent regarding his missing F-1 report for calendar year 2018, that was due not later than April 15, 2019. As of the date of the hearing on March 25, 2021, the Respondent has not filed the F-1 report for calendar year 2018.

- 3. Between February and May of 2020, PDC staff emailed nine reminders to the Respondent regarding his missing F-1 report for the calendar year 2019, which was due no later than April 15, 2020. On June 17, 2020, PDC staff also emailed a warning letter to the Respondent regarding his missing F-1 report for calendar year 2019. As of the date of the hearing on March 25, 2021, the Respondent has not filed his F-1 report for calendar year 2019.
- 4. From July 27, 2020, through October 7, 2020, PDC staff made telephone calls to elected and appointed officials and to representatives in the jurisdictions in which they serve, reminding them of their missed obligation to file the F-1 report covering the calendar year 2019, that was due no later than April 15, 2020.
- 5. On March 11, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent, by email and by mail to the address of record, with a hearing notice for an adjudicative proceeding on March 25, 2021, before the full Commission concerning his failure to file the F-1 reports.
- 6. As of the date of the hearing on March 25, 2021, the PDC has had no contact from the Respondent concerning the late F-1 reports. The last F-1 report received from the Respondent covered financial activity from August 22, 2016, through August 21, 2017, and was filed on August 22, 2017.
- 7. The Respondent has one prior violation of RCW 42.17A.700 within the past five years (PDC Case 38893). In that matter, the Respondent, who was a candidate for Parks & Recreation Commissioner in Klickitat Recreation District in 2018, failed to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2017, that was due no later than April 16, 2018.

- 8. At a September 24, 2018, Brief Adjudicative Proceeding the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$250 penalty for failing to file an F-1 report that was due not later than April 16, 2018 (PDC Case 38893).
- 9. As of the date of the hearing on March 25, 2021, the Respondent has not paid the outstanding \$250 civil penalty for PDC Case 38893 and the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2017 has not been filed.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the
Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

III. ORDER

As a result of Respondent's failure to file the required F-1 reports, and after consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, and the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission finds the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to timely file his F-1 reports for calendar years 2018 and 2019, and is assessed a civil penalty of \$500. This Order will be the Final Order.

- 1. The \$500 civil penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order.
- The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2018 and 2019 shall be filed within 30 days of the date of this Order.
