The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated March 25, 2021, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Hearing Notice sent to Respondent on March 11, 2021, for Adjudicative Proceedings on March 25, 2021;
- 3. F-1 Report covering calendar year 2016, filed June 23, 2017;
- PDC Case 38970 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order Imposing Fine, dated October 5, 2018.

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves alleged repeat violations of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) no later than April 15, 2019, and April 15, 2020, for calendar years 2018 and 2019 respectively. The case is being heard pursuant to RCW 34.05.482(1)(c), and WAC 390-37-143(4-5) which require review by the full Commission.

- 1. Aiomanu Betty Patu served as School Director for Seattle School District 001 for the term November 7, 2017, through July 1, 2019.
- 2. In March and April of 2019, PDC staff emailed eight reminders to the Respondent regarding her missing F-1 report for calendar year 2018. As of the date of hearing on March 25, 2021, the Respondent has not filed the F-1 report for calendar year 2018, that was due April 15, 2019.

- 3. In April and May of 2020, PDC staff emailed three reminders to the Respondent regarding her missing F-1 report for the calendar year 2019. On June 17, 2020, PDC staff emailed a warning letter to the Respondent regarding her missing F-1 report for calendar year 2019. As of the date of the hearing on March 25, 2021, the Respondent has not filed the F-1 report for calendar year 2019, that was due April 15, 2020.
- 4. From July 27, 2020, through October 7, 2020, PDC staff made telephone calls to elected and appointed officials and to representatives in the jurisdictions in which they serve, reminding them of their missed obligation to file the F-1 report covering the calendar year 2019.
- 5. On March 11, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent, by email and by mail to the address of record, with a hearing notice for an adjudicative proceeding on March 25, 2021, before the full Commission concerning her failure to file the F-1 reports. The emailed notice was also sent to a second email address the jurisdiction provided to PDC staff in February, 2021.
- 6. The PDC has had no contact from the Respondent concerning the late F-1 reports. The last F-1 report received from the Respondent covered the 2016 calendar year and was filed on June 23, 2017.
- 7. The Respondent has one prior violation of RCW 42.17A.700 within the past five years (PDC Case 38970). In that matter, the Respondent failed to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2017, that was due no later than April 16, 2018. At a September 24, 2018, Brief Adjudicative Proceeding the Respondent was found in violation of RCW

42.17A.700 and assessed a \$250 penalty. As of the date of the hearing on March 25, 2021, the Respondent has not paid the outstanding \$250 civil penalty for PDC Case 38970 and the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2017 has not been filed.

## II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the
Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

## III. ORDER

As a result of Respondent's failure to file the required F-1 reports, and after consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, and the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission finds the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to timely file her F-1 reports for calendar years 2018 and 2019, and is assessed a civil penalty of \$500. This Order will be the Final Order.

1. The \$500 civil penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order.

2. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2018 and 2019 shall be filed within 30 days of the date of this Order.

3. In the event the Respondent fails to pay the \$500 civil penalty within 30 days of the date of the Order, PDC staff are directed to refer the matter to collections without further action of the Commission.
