At the February 25, 2021, Brief Enforcement hearing, the Presiding Officer assessed a total civil penalty of \$1,500 in accordance with WAC 390-37-143. 14	I. INTRODUCTION		
15	This matter was heard remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission		
16	(Commission) on February 25, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. The hearing		
17	was held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.		
18	Commissioners present were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis,		
19	Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William Downing and Russell Lehman. Also		
20	present were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant		
21	Attorney General Chad Standifer representing Commission staff, and Tabitha Townsend,		
22	Compliance Coordinator, on behalf of PDC Staff. Respondent Ronnie Little did not appear on		
23	her own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation		
24	20-28 et seq. and recorded.		
25	The hearing concerned allegations that Ronnie Little (Respondent) violated RCW		
26	42.17A.700 by failing to timely file a Personal F	inancial Affairs Statement (F-1 report)

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13		II. FINDINGS OF FACT
14		1. Ronnie Little is an incumbent Fire Commissioner for King County Fire
15	Protection District #40. She has served in this position since 2009 and her current term expires	
16	December 31, 2021.	
17		2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official is required to file
18	a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) disclosing financial activities for calendar	
19	year 2019 no later than April 15, 2020. To date, the Respondent has failed to file the report.	
20		3. On March 5, 2018, Ms. Little filed her F-1 report covering calendar year 2017.
21		4. On February 28, 2019, Ms. Little filed her F-1 report covering calendar year 2018.
22		5. Between February and April of 2020, PDC staff sent all elected and appointed
23	officia	ls six email reminders regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2019.
24		6. PDC staff emailed reminders that the deadline of April 15, 2020, had been missed
25	on Ap	ril 22, 2020, April 29, 2020, and May 5, 2020.

1	7. On February 12, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent by electronic mail with	
2	a hearing notice for a February 25, 2021, Adjudicative Proceeding before the full Public	
3	Disclosure Commission concerning the failure to file the F-1 report.	
4	7. Prior violations of RCW 42.17A.700:	
5 6	<ul> <li>a) First Violation, PDC Case No. 16-039:</li> <li>The Respondent failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2014, which was due no later than April 15, 2015.</li> </ul>

9	To date, the Respondent has not paid the civil penalty.

15	• The Respondent failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2016, which was due no later than April 17, 2017.	
16 17	• On February 27, 2018, a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) was held before the full Commission, in which the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty for failing to file an F-1 report, which was due no later than April 17, 2017.	
18	<ul> <li>To date the Respondent has not paid the \$1,000 civil penalty or filed the missing</li> </ul>	
19	F-1 report for calendar year 2016.	
20	8. Staff recommended at the February 25, 2021, hearing a civil penalty of \$1,500	
21	pursuant to the penalty schedule in WAC 390-37-182.

23	III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW	
24	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17.	
25	RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative	
26		

Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.	
2. Based on the above Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and hearing testimony, the	
Commission concludes:	
a. Ronnie Little violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file F-1 financial	
reports for the year 2019.	
IV. ORDER	
Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that:	
1. Respondent Ronnie Little is assessed a total civil penalty of \$1,500 which shall	
be paid within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.	
2. The missing F-1 report for calendar year 2019 shall be filed within 30 days of the	
date of this Order. If the Respondent fails to comply with the filing of the F-1	
report or fails to make timely payment of the civil penalties, PDC staff may send	
the amounts due for collection without further action by the Commission.
