Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and **Order Imposing Fine**

Pursuant to the brief enforcement hearing (brief adjudicative proceeding) notice sent to John McCoy (the "Respondent") on January 11, 2021, a brief adjudicative proceeding was held on January 28, 2021, remotely from Olympia, WA by live audio and online transmission, to consider whether the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file the required annual F-1 report (Personal Financial Affairs Statement) as an elected official in 2019. The F-1 report, disclosing financial information for 2019, was due to be filed not later than April 15, 2020.

The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 RCW, 42.17A RCW and Chapter 390-37 WAC. Commission Chair Fred Jarrett was the Presiding Officer. The Commission staff was represented by Tabatha Blacksmith, Compliance Coordinator.

Having considered the evidence, the Presiding Officer finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Respondent was an elected official serving as State Senator for Leg. District 38 Senate for the term January 1, 2019 through April 17, 2020.
- 2. As an elected official, the Respondent was required to file an F-1 report (Personal Financial Affairs Statement) with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) by April 15, 2020.
- 3. The Respondent filed the F-1 report on January 27, 2021, after the hearing notice and the enforcement hearing.
- 4. The Respondent has no prior violations of RCW 42.17A.700 with the Public Disclosure Commission.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above facts, as a matter of law, the Presiding Officer concludes as follows:

- 1. This matter was duly and properly convened, and all jurisdictional, substantive, and procedural requirements have been satisfied.
- 2. The Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file an F-1 report by April 15, 2020.

ORDER

ON the basis of the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Respondent is assessed a civil penalty of \$250, with \$100 of the penalty suspended, in accordance with the F-1 penalty schedule set forth in WAC 390-37-143.

It is further ordered that the Respondent:

- 1. Pay the non-suspended \$150 civil penalty within 30 days of the date of this Order.
- 2. File the missing F-1 report within 30 days of the date of this Order.
- 3. Commit no further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC for a period of 4 years from the date of this order or the suspended \$100 will become due and payable without further Commission action.

The \$150 non-suspended portion of the penalty is due to be paid within 30 days of the date of this Order. If the Respondent fails to pay the non-suspended penalty of \$150 within 30 days or fails to comply with any of the conditions of this Order, the suspended portion of the penalty shall immediately become due without further action by the Commission.

In the event the Respondent fails to pay the non-suspended \$150 civil penalty within 30 days of the date of the Order, PDC staff is directed to refer the matter to collections.

This is an **Initial Order** of the Public Disclosure Commission.

APPEALS OF INITIAL ORDER

REVIEW OF INITIAL ORDER - BY THE COMMISSION

You may request that the full Commission review this initial order. To seek review, you must:

- Make the request orally or in writing, stating the reason for review, and identifying what alleged errors are contained in the initial order. *See* WAC 390-37-144(1). Staff may ask for written confirmation of oral requests for review.
- REQUESTS FOR REVIEW MUST BE <u>RECEIVED</u> BY THE COMMISSION WITHIN <u>TWENTY-ONE</u> (21) <u>CALENDAR DAYS</u> AFTER THE POSTMARK DATE OF THIS INITIAL ORDER. Written requests for review should be delivered electronically to the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission by email at pdc@pdc.wa.gov

If review of this initial order is timely requested, the full Commission will hear the matter. If the Commission is unable to schedule a meeting to consider the request within twenty (20) calendar days, this initial order becomes a final order, and any request for review will automatically be considered a request for reconsideration of a final order. See WAC 390-37-144(4). The matter would then be scheduled for consideration and disposition at the next Commission meeting at which it is practicable to do so.

A Respondent does not need to pay a penalty until after the Commission rules on a request for review of an initial order.

FURTHER APPEAL RIGHTS – SUPERIOR COURT

If the Commission does not receive a request for review of this initial order within twenty-one (21) calendar days, the initial order shall be the final order. *See* WAC 390-37-142(5).

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO APPEAL A FINAL ORDER TO SUPERIOR COURT, PURSUANT TO THE PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW PROVISIONS OF RCW 34.05.552.
