Hello. I received this notification and spent some time piecing together what happened, and it's unclear to me if I'm out of compliance or not.

I received a \$4,000 contribution from a married couple on primary election day when I came home from work, and I assumed it was to be attributed to each of them making a \$1,000 contribution for the primary and general elections – but just in case, I called the next day and asked. Turns out I was right, so I deposited the check the day after that, August 6, 2020 and attributed it accordingly.

I'm not sure what — if anything — I did wrong and if so, how I should go about making it right. I'm in the habit of depositing checks on the day I receive them whenever possible, so I'm not real diligent about differentiating between the date I receive a check and the day I deposit it on the C-3 form, and that is likely what I did wrong that triggered the complaint. The circumstances of this transaction are such that I'm simply not sure if there are other technical violations of the rules, but if so, let me know and I'll do whatever you tell me to do.

I'm a 69-year-old man who never learned to type, so email isn't the fastest way for me to communicate, and I get that a written record is necessary – but feel free to call me at 253-370-5737 and it'll smooth out any clarification questions I might have.
