LEHRMAN, 10 Respondent. 11 12 13 This matter was heard remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission 14 (Commission) on September 23, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. Respondent 15 requested review of the Initial Order within 21 calendar days of the order being served on him. 16 The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 17 WAC. 18 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 19 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; Commissioner Bill Downing, and 20 Commissioner Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 21 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 22 Chad Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Jennifer Hansen, PDC Compliance Officer. 23 Respondent Scott M. Lehrman appeared on his own behalf. The proceeding was open to the 24 public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 et seq. and recorded. 25

1. Case memorandum dated September 15, 2021, prepared by Jennifer Hansen, PDC 2. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, PDC Case 94109, sent to Respondent on June 25, 2021, for Adjudicative Proceedings on July 15, 2021; 3. Initial Order Imposing Fine, PDC Case 94109, entered August 16, 2021; 4. Respondent's written request for review dated September 2, 2021; 5. Reconsideration Hearing Notice, PDC Case 94109, served September 15, 2021, and the corrected notice served September 17, 2021. FINDINGS OF FACT The matter involves an alleged violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) no later than April 15, 2021, for calendar year Scott D. Lehrman served as School Director for Pasco School District 001 during the calendar year 2020. His current term expires December 31, 2023. The Respondent Between February and May of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.

3. On May 11, 2021, PDC staff emailed warning letters to elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.

- 4. On June 25, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held on July 15, 2021. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email address of record.
- 5. At the July 15, 2021, Brief Enforcement Hearing the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file the F-1 report no later than April 15, 2021, and was assessed a \$250 penalty, with \$150 suspended, consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule adopted by the Commission
- 6. On August 16, 2021, PDC staff served the Initial Order memorializing the Commission's ruling by email to the contact email address of record.
- 7. Respondent filed the F-1 report covering calendar year 2020 activity on August 19, 2021.
- 8. On September 2, 2021, Respondent contacted PDC staff in writing to appeal the August 16, 2021, by telephone to appeal the August 16, 2021 order based on the fact that he serves in a volunteer position without pay. He also apologized for the late submittal and expressed his intent to file timely in the future.
- 9. On September 15, 2021, PDC staff served Respondent by email with a hearing notice for a September 23, 2021, Hearing on Reconsideration before the Commission,

along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely. On September 17, 2021, staff served the Respondent with a corrected hearing notice to reflect the appropriate agenda time.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
- 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office in 2020 was required to file an F-1 report, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2020, no later than April 15, 2021.

III. ORDER

After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, including Respondent's written appeal and testimony, and the Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission AFFIRMS the Initial Order assessing a civil penalty of \$250, with \$150 suspended, for late filing of the F-1 report in violation of RCW 42.17A.700. This Order will be the Final Order.

1. Respondent Scott D. Lehrman is assessed a total civil penalty of \$250, with \$150 suspended, on the following conditions:

- a. The \$100 non-suspended portion of the civil penalties due for violation of RCW 42.17A.700 are paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
- b. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
- 2. If the Respondent fails to make timely payment of the non-suspended portion (\$100) of the 2020 calendar year civil penalties in full within 30 days of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty shall immediately become due without further action by the Commission.
