Earmarked contributions are defined in WAC 390-16-240 (1), which reads: Earmarked contributions, as that term is used in RCW 42.17A.270 and 42.17A.460, means any contribution given to an intermediary or conduit, either a political committee, candidate or third party, with a designation, instruction, or encumbrance, whether direct or indirect, express or implied, oral or written, which is intended to result in or which does result in all or any part of the contribution being made to or **for the promotion of a certain candidate, state official, or ballot proposition.**

The project referenced by Mr. Joe Yates utilized several contributions, including that from Ms Jensen, criticized Michelle Caldier and did not promote any candidate.

All but one of the exhibits provided by Mr. Joe Yates had absolutely nothing to do with Working Families of King County PAC.
