WILLIAM CHAPPELL, 12 Respondent. 13 14 This matter was heard remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission 15 (Commission) on October 12, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. Respondent C. 16 William Chappell requested review of the Presiding Officer's Order entered on September 13, 17 2021, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) on August 12, 18 2021, in this matter. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, 19 and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 20 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 21 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William 22 Downing and Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 23 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 24 Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Jennifer Hansen, PDC Compliance Coordinator. 25

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Notice was provided to the Respondent and he appeared on his own behalf. The proceeding was

open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-25 et. seq. and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated October 12, 2021, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice served July 20, 2021;
- 3. Initial Order Imposing Fine, entered September 13, 2021;

- 5. Financial Affairs Statement for EY 2021, filed September 14, 2021;
- 6. Respondent's written request for review, dated September 15, 2021;
- 7. Review of Initial Order Hearing Notice, dated October 4, 2021.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involved Respondent's request that the Commission review an Initial Order entered on September 13, 2021, resulting from an Initial Hearing on August 12, 2021, regarding C. William Chappell, a candidate for City Council Member of the City of Duvall during election year 2021. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 for failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) and RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than June 4, 2021. At the August 12, 2021, hearing, an Order was entered imposing a \$500 penalty, with \$200 suspended, which the Respondent now requests the Commission review. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.

1. In May and June of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all candidates for election year 2021 regarding their missing C-1 Report, F-1 Report, or both.

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	2.	On June 17, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a Warning Notice
2		regarding the C-1 and F-1 Reports. The hearing notice was sent to the
3		Respondent's email address of record.
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5	3.	On July 20, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice for a
6		Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held on
7		August 12, 2021. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email
8		address of record.
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10	4.	At the Brief Enforcement Hearing held on August 12, 2021, the Respondent
11		was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 and .700 for failure to timely file
12		the missing C-1 and F-1 Reports no later than June 4, 2021 and was assessed a
13		\$500 penalty consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing
14		penalty schedule adopted by the Commission. The Presiding Office suspended
15		\$200 of the \$500 penalty conditioned upon the Respondent filing the missing C-
16		1 and F-1 reports and paying the non-suspended \$300 penalty within 30 days of
17		the Initial Order being entered.
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19	5.	On September 14, 2021, the Respondent was served with the Initial Order
20		memorializing the Commission's ruling to the Respondent's email address of
21		record.
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23	6.	The Respondent filed the C-1 and F-1 reports on September 14, 2021.
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25	7.	On September 14, 2021, the Respondent submitted written materials appealing
26		the September 13, 2021 order stating that he did not receive the mailed hearing

He further stated he did not realize the reports were required for a campaign that is not raising or spending money, and that he had immediately contacted the PDC and filed the missing reports. On October 4, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent, by email, with a hearing notice for a October 12, 2021 Review Hearing along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely.
9		II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
10		II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
11	1.	The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
12		42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
13		RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
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15	2.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.205, a candidate for election year 2021 was required to
16		file a C-1 Report within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.
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18	3.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, a candidate for election year 2021 was required
19		to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for the prior twelve
20		months, within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.
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22		III. ORDER
23	This C	order on Review will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating
24	and aggravatii	ng factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Initial Hearing
25	Order assessir	ng a \$500 civil penalty, with \$200 suspended, is MODIFIED as follows:
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1	1. Respondent C. William Chappell is assessed a total civil penalty of \$500, with
2	\$400 suspended, on the following conditions:
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4	a. The \$100 non-suspended portion of the civil penalties due for violation
5	of RCW 42.17A.205 and .700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days
6	of the date of this Final Order.
7	b. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting
8	requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of
9	Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of
10	this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely
11	upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the
12	Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
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14	2. If the Respondent fails to make timely payment of the non-suspended portion
15	(\$100) of the 2020 calendar year civil penalties in full within 30 days of this order,
16	the suspended civil penalty (\$400) shall be immediately become due without
17	further action by the Commission.
