Respondent 16 James Muchina-Njoroge requested review of the Presiding Officer's Order entered on September 17 13, 2021, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) on August 18 12, 2021, in this matter. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A 19 RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 20 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 21 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William 22 Downing and Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 23 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 24 Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Jennifer Hansen, PDC Compliance Coordinator. 25 Notice was provided to the Respondent and he appeared on his own behalf. The proceeding was

open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-25 et. seq. and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated October 12, 2021, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, served July 20, 2021;
- 3. Initial Order Imposing Fine, entered September 13, 2021;
- 4. Respondent's emails dated July 20, 2021 through September 22, 2021, and written request for appeal, received September 22, 2021;
- 5. Review of Initial Order Hearing Notice, dated October 4, 2021.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involved Respondent's request that the Commission review an Initial Order entered on September 13, 2021, resulting from an Initial Hearing on August 12, 2021, regarding James Muchina-Njoroge, who mistakenly filed as a candidate for School Director for Bethel School District 403 during election year 2021. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 for failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) and RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than June 4, 2021. At the August 12, 2021, hearing, the Presiding Officer imposed a \$500 penalty, with \$200 suspended, which the Respondent now requests the Commission review. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.

1. In May and June of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all candidates for election year 2021 regarding their missing C-1 Report, F-1 Report, or both.

1	2.	On June 17, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a Warning Notice
2		regarding the C-1 and F-1 Reports. The hearing notice was sent to the
3		Respondent's email address of record.
4		
5	3.	On July 20, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice for a
6		Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held on
7		August 12, 2021. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email
8		address of record.
9		
10	4.	At the Brief Enforcement Hearing held on August 12, 2021, the Respondent
11		was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 and .700 for failure to timely file
12		the missing C-1 and F-1 Reports no later than June 4, 2021, and was assessed a
13		\$500 penalty consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing
14		penalty schedule adopted by the Commission. The Presiding Officer suspended
15		\$200 of the \$500 penalty conditioned upon the Respondent filing the missing C-
16		1 and F-1 reports and paying the non-suspended \$300 penalty within 30 days of
17		the Initial Order being entered.
18		
19	5.	On September 14, 2021, the Respondent was served with the Initial Order
20		memorializing the Commission's ruling to the Respondent's email address of
21		record.
22		
23	6.	Between July 20, 2021, and September 22, 2021, the Respondent sent the PDC
24		emails stating he was not running for office, does not understand how candidacy
25		works, and filed by mistake when he intended to apply to be a substitute
26		teacher. PDC staff confirmed his intentions by phone on September 22, 2021.

1		PDC staff also contacted Pierce County Elections who stated the deadline to
2		withdraw as a candidate was May 28, 2021, and there was no filing fee required
3		to become a candidate for School Director.

5	7.	On September 22, 2021, the Respondent submitted written materials appealing
6	7.	the September 13, 2021 order stating that he had never intended to become a
7		
8		candidate and would not accept the position if elected.

10	8.	On October 4, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent, by email, with a hearing
11		notice for an October 12, 2021 Review Hearing along with instructions on how
12		to participate in the hearing remotely.
13		
14		II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
15	1.	The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
16		42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
17		RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
18		
19	2.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.205, a candidate for election year 2021 was required
20		to file a C-1 Report within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.
21		
22	3.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, a candidate for election year 2021 was required
23		to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for the prior twelve
24		months, within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.

2	This Order on Review will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating			
3	and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Initial Hearing			
4	Order assessing a \$500 civil penalty, with \$200 suspended, is VACATED.			
5	Order assessing a \$500 ervir penancy, with \$200 suspended, is \$71e71125.
