Respondent 16 Ronnie Little was provided notice on October 14, 2021, of the hearing date. The hearing was 17 held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 18 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 19 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William 20 Downing and Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 21 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 22 Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Coordinator. 23 Notice was provided to the Respondent and she did not appear on her own behalf. The 24 proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-25 et. seq. and 25

recorded.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent Ronnie Little, an incumbent and candidate for Fire Commissioner for King County Fire Protection District #40 in the 2021 election cycle. She has served since 2009 and her current term expires December 31, 2021. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.205 for failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) within two weeks of becoming a candidate or no later than June 4, 2021, and RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2021, disclosing financial information for the calendar year 2020. The Respondent has an outstanding penalty balance of \$3,100 with the PDC, including two prior violations within the statute of limitations. Due to the prior violations, the case was brought directly to the full Commission for review.

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1	1.	The current C-1 and F-1 Reports have not been filed as of the date of this hearing	
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3	2.	There are two prior cases for violations of RCW 42.17A.700:	
4		• PDC Case 80252. At a February 25, 2021, Enforcement Hearing,	
5		Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failing	
6		to file F-1 reports for calendar year 2019, which was due not later	
7		than April 15, 2020. A total civil penalty of \$1,500 was assessed	
8		in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the	
9		Commission that was in effect at that time.	
10		• PDC Case 25923. At a February 27, 2018, Enforcement Hearing,	
11		Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 by failing	
12		to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2016, that was due not later	
13		than April 17, 2017. A civil penalty of \$1,000 was assessed in	
14		accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the Commission	
15		that was in effect at that time.

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18	4.	The Respondent filed her F-1 covering the calendar year 2017 on March 5,	
19		2018;	
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21	5.	The Respondent filed her F-1 covering the calendar year 2018 on February 28,	
22		2019.	
23	6.	On October 14, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent, by mail, with a hearing	
24		notice for an October 28, 2021, Enforcement Hearing along with instructions on	
25	how to participate in the hearing remotely. On October 18, 2021, PDC Staff		
26		served the Respondent by email with the same notice.	
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2		II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW	
3		n. Conclusions of Law	
4	1.	The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter	
5		42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05	
6		RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.	
7			
8	2.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.205, a candidate for election year 2021, was required	
9		to file a C-1 Report within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.	
10			
11	3.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an incumbent candidate for election year 2021	
12		was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for calendar	
13		year 2020 no later than April 15, 2021	
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15		III. ORDER	
16	This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and		
17	aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission		
18	assesses a civil penalty of \$1,000 for the late filed C-1 Report and \$3,000 for the late filed F-1		
19	Report for a total civil fine of \$4,000.		
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21		a. Payment of the civil fine shall be made in full within 30 days of the	
22		issuance of this order. If payment is not made within 30 days of the	
23		issuance of this order, the amount owing may be send to collection	
24		without further action of the Commission.	
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26		b. The Respondent shall remain in full compliance with all PDC reporting	
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1	requirements an	nd shall not be found to have committed any further			
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3	violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four year				
4	of the date of this Final Order.
