It appears that public funds were used to produce this campaign pamphlet and it is biased towards convincing voters to vote "for" the proposal. This is clearly in violation of state law. State law does not allow public funds to be used to influence voters. It is in the interest of everyone that public entities do not send out "informational" pamphlets to voters.



WHO WE ARE

Medic One provides pre-hospital emergency medical services to the residents of Thurston County. We also provide training, equipment, supplies, and medical oversight for responders.

WHAT IS THE ISSUE?

Medic One is supported by a permanent property tax levy that was passed in 1999. This levy is allowed by law to grow at 1% plus new construction. However, medical service costs including pharmaceuticals, medical supplies, paramedic salaries, and patient care equipment, matched or exceeded revenue every year.



WHAT WILL THIS COST ME?


By restoring the levy to \$0.35/\$1,000 property value in 2022, and increasing it by \$0.03/\$1,000 property value in years 2023-2027, the levy would be fully restored to its 1999 voter approved rate of \$0.50/\$1,000 property value in the final year of the stair-step restoration.

WHAT IF THE LEVY DOES NOT PASS?

- Defer modernization and replacement of medical equipment, including paramedic units.
- Cancel the deployment of the 8th Medic Unit in the county
- Reduce the citizen CPR training program by 64 percent
- Reduce financial support to fire agencies for medical equipment, supplies and training for EMTs


HOW MUCH REVENUE WILL MEDIC ONE GAIN?

In order to keep pace with costs for medical services, Medic One needs to increase revenue. Proposition 1 seeks to gradually increase revenue through a property tax restoration at a rate that nearly matches anticipated expenditures over the next 6 years.



This levy will restore the rate back to the original 1999 voter approved \$0.50 cents per thousand of assessed property value over the next 6 years.
