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14	I. INTRODUCTION	
15	This matter was heard in-person and remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure	
16	Commission (Commission) on June 23, 2022, by telephonic and online streaming access. The	
17	hearing was held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37	
18	WAC.	
19	Commissioners present in-person and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair	
20	(presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners Allen Hayward and	
21	Jocelyn Cooney. Also present were Assistant Attorney General Matthew Kernutt representing	
22	the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer representing Commission staff, and	
23	Jordan Campbell, Compliance Coordinator, on behalf of PDC Staff. Respondent Warren Small	
24	did not appear on his own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by	
25	Governor's Proclamation 20-28 et seq. and recorded.	
26	The hearing concerned allegations that War	ren Small (Respondent) violated RCW

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1	42.17A.700 by failing to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report)	
2	disclosing personal financial information for calendar year 2021, that was due no later than April	
3	15, 2022.	
4	The Commissioners had before them the following materials:	
5	o Case Memorandum for PDC Case No. 108753 prepared by Jordan Campbell and dated	
6	June 15, 2022;	
7	o Full Enforcement Hearing Notice for PDC Case No. 108753, dated June 13, 2021;	
8	o PDC Case No. 38965, Final Order, entered November 1, 2018.	
9	o PDC Case No. 94207, Final Order, entered February 15, 2022.	
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11	II. FINDINGS OF FACT	
12	1. Warren Small has served as School Director for Royal School District 160 since	
13	approximately 2014. His term ended on December 31, 2021.	
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15	2. From March 10, 2022, through April 28, 2022, PDC staff sent all elected and	
16	appointed officials email reminders regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2021.	
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18	3. On June 13, 2022, PDC staff served the Respondent by electronic mail with a	
19	hearing notice for a June 23, 2022, hearing. The notice was sent to Respondent's mail and email	
20	address of record.	
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22	4. As of the date of the hearing, Respondent has not filed his F-1 report covering	
23	calendar year 2021.	
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25	5. Prior violations of RCW 42.17A.700:	
26	a) First Violation, PDC Case No. 38965:	
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1 2	• The Respondent failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2017, which was due no later than April 16, 2018.		
3	• On October 25, 2018, an Order imposing Fine was entered for violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and a civil penalty was assessed for \$1,500.		
4	• The Respondent filed the F-1 report for calendar year 2017 on October		
5	25, 2018, and paid the \$1,500 civil fine on December 13, 2018.		
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7	b) Second Violation, PDC Case No. 94207:		
8	• The Respondent failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2020, which was due not later than April 15, 2021.		
9	• On January 27, 2022, an Enforcement Hearing was held before the full		
10	Commission, at which the Respondent was found to be in violation of		
11	RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$1,500 penalty for failing to timely file an F-1 report that was due no later than April 15, 2021.		
12	• The Respondent filed the F-1 report on January 27, 2022, but has not paid		
13	the \$1,500 civil penalty.		
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15	6. Staff recommended at the June 23, 2022, hearing a civil penalty of between		
16	\$2,000 and \$3,000 pursuant to the penalty schedule in WAC 390-37-182.		
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18	III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW		
19	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A		
20	RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative		
21	Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.		
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23	2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official is required to file a		
24	Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) disclosing financial activities for calendar year		
	2021, no later than April 15, 2022.		
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IV. ORDER

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that:

- 1. Respondent Warren Small is assessed a total civil penalty of \$2,000, with \$500 suspended on the following conditions:
 - a. The \$1,500 non-suspended portion of the civil penalties due for violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - b. The \$1,500 past due penalty for PDC Case No. 94207 is paid by Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - c. The missing F-1 report for PDC Case 108753 for calendar year 2021 is filed with the PDC within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - d. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A. RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
- 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar year 2021 shall immediately become due without further action of the commission. PDC staff may also send all amounts due for collection or to Superior Court for enforcement without further action by the Commission.
