At the July 28, 2022 Enforcement hearing, the Commission assessed a total civil penalty of \$3,000 of which \$1,000 is suspended in accordance with WAC 390-37-182. The \$2,000 non-suspended penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order, which is **September 12, 2022**.

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15 This matter was heard remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission
16 (Commission) on July 28, 2022, by telephonic and online streaming access. Respondent Pedro
17 Olguin was provided notice on July 14, 2022, of the hearing date. The hearing was held in
18 accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

19 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission
20 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William
21 Downing, Allen Hayward, and Jocelyn Cooney. Also present both telephonically and online
22 were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant
23 Attorney General Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Jordan Campbell, PDC
24 Compliance Coordinator. Notice was provided to the Respondent and he did not appear on his
25 own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-
26 25 *et seq.* and recorded.

1 The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

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- 3 1. Case memorandum dated July 20, 2022, prepared by Jordan Campbell, PDC
- 4 Compliance Coordinator;
- 5 2. Hearing Notice, mailed and dated July 14, 2022;
- 6 3. Statement of Understanding resolving PDC Case 23039, filed August 17, 2017;
- 7 4. Warning Letter resolving PDC Case 58175, sent January 3, 2020;
- 8 5. Initial Order for prior violation, PDC Case 94173, served February 3, 2022.
- 9

10 I. FINDINGS OF FACT

11 The matter involves Respondent Pedro Olguin, a former City Council Member for the
12 City of Burien. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely
13 file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission
14 no later than April 15, 2022, disclosing financial information for the calendar year 2021. The
15 Respondent has an outstanding penalty balance from three prior violations with the PDC of
16 \$1,000.

- 18 1. In March and April of 2022, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and
- 19 appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2021.
- 20
- 21 2. On May 11, 2022, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a warning notice regarding
- 22 the missing F-1 report.
- 23
- 24 3. On July 14, 2022, PDC Staff served the Respondent by email and mail, with a
- 25 hearing notice for a July 28, 2022, Enforcement Hearing, along with instructions
- 26

1 on how to participate in the hearing remotely, before the full Public Disclosure
2 Commission concerning his failure to file the F-1 report.
3

4 4. As of the date of the hearing the Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report
5 covering calendar year 2021 that was due no later than April 15, 2022.
6

7 5. The past due F-1 Report for 2020, has not been filed as of the date of this hearing.
8

9 6. There are three prior cases for violations of RCW 42.17A.700:
10

- 11 • PDC Case 23039. The Respondent, who was a candidate for City
12 Council Member for the City of Burien, failed to file an F-1 report
13 for the previous 12 months prior to becoming a candidate, which
14 was due no later than two weeks after he became a candidate in the
15 2017 election. Respondent was found in violation of RCW
16 42.17A.700 and the case was resolved through a Statement of
17 Understanding and payment of a \$100 penalty.
18

- 19 • PDC Case 58175. The Respondent failed to timely disclose a
20 stipend paid to City Council Members at the City of Burien on
21 their F-1 report. He was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700
22 and the case was resolved through a written Warning Letter which
23 can be considered in deciding later enforcement actions if there are
24 further violations.

- PDC Case 94173. At a February 3, 2022, Brief Adjudicative Proceeding the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$1,000 penalty for failing to file a F-1 report that was due no later than April 15, 2021. As of July 28, 2022, Respondent has not paid the outstanding civil penalty nor has he filed the missing F-1 report.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
3. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office in 2021 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2021 no later than April 15, 2022.

III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission assesses a civil penalty of \$3,000 for the outstanding F-1 Report for calendar year 2021 with \$1,000 suspended on the following conditions:

1. a. The \$2,000 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2021 in violation of

1 RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date
2 of this Final Order.

3
4 b. The past due civil penalties for failure to timely file the F-1
5 report for calendar year 2020, in violation of RCW 42.17A.700, totaling
6 \$1,000 plus costs is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of
7 this Final Order.

8
9 c. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2020 and 2021, are
10 filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.

11
12 d. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC
13 reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further
14 violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years
15 of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be
16 assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or
17 error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a
18 technical correction.

20 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within
21 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar
22 year 2021 shall immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection
23 or brought to Superior Court as allowed by law without further action by the
24 Commission.
