Respondent 16 Heidi Cao requested reconsideration of the Presiding Officer's Order entered on September 29, 17 2022, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) on September 1, 18 2022, in this matter. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, 19 and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 20 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Nancy Isserlis, Commission 21 Vice-Chair (presiding); and Commissioners William Downing, Allen Haywood, and Jocelyn 22 Cooney. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. 23 Meader representing the Commission, Senior Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer and 24 Assistant Attorney General Susie Giles-Klein, representing PDC Staff, and Jordan Campbell, 25

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PDC Compliance Coordinator. Notice was provided to the Respondent and she appeared on her

own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated November 30, 2022, prepared by Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, served July 25, 2022;
- Initial Order Imposing Fine, entered September 29, 2022;
- Respondent's F-1 report filed October 19, 2022;
- Respondent's written request for reconsideration, dated October 19, 2022;
- Reconsideration Hearing Notice, served November 23, 2022.

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

This matter involves Respondent's request that the Commission reconsider an Initial Order entered on September 29, 2022, resulting from an Initial Hearing on September 1, 2022, regarding Heidi Cao, a former Professional Staff member with the House of Representatives whose term of employment ended October 29, 2921. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2022. At the September 1, 2022, hearing, an Order was entered imposing a \$250 penalty, with \$125 suspended, which the Respondent now requests the Commission reconsider. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.

1. In March and April of 2022, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2021.

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2	2.	On July 25, 2022, PDC staff mailed and emailed the Respondent a hearing
2		notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be
3		held on September 1, 2022. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's
4		official mail and email address of record for House staff.
5		
6	3.	At the Brief Enforcement Hearing held on September 1, 2022, the Respondent
7		was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file the missing
8		F-1 Report no later than April 15, 2022, and was assessed a \$250 penalty
9		
10		consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty
11		schedule adopted by the Commission. The Presiding Officer suspended \$125 of
12		the \$250 penalty conditioned upon the Respondent filing the missing F-1 report
13		and paying the non-suspended \$125 penalty within 30 days of the Initial Order
		being entered.
14		
15	4.	On September 29, 2022, the Respondent was served with the September 1,
16		2022, Initial Order memorializing the Commission's ruling to the Respondent's
17		mailing and email address of record which were the official addresses for House
18		staff.
19		
20	5.	Respondent filed the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2021 on October 19,

24	6.	On October 19, 2022, Respondent contacted PDC staff by email to appeal the
		penalty assessed in the Initial Order. She requested reconsideration on the
25		grounds she was not aware of the filing requirement due to her not having
26		

1		access to her House email account and that PDC records did not have her		
2		correct contact information.

4	7.	On November 23, 2022, PDC staff served the Respondent by mail and email		
5	/.	with a hearing notice for a December 8, 2022, Reconsideration Hearing before		
6		the Public Disclosure Commission, along with instructions on how to

11	1.	The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter		
12		42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05		
13		RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.		
14				
15	2.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office		
16		in 2021, or took office in 2021, was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing		
17		financial information for the calendar year 2021, no later than April 15, 2022.		
18				
19		III. ORDER		
20	This Order on Reconsideration will be the Final Order. After consideration of the			
21	mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the			
22	Initial Hearing Order imposing a \$250 civil penalty, with \$125 suspended, is MODIFIED as			
23	follows:

25	1.	Respondent Heidi Cao is found to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to		
26		timely file her F-1 report no later than April 15, 2022.

2	2. Respondent's civil penalty of \$250 is VACATED.
