MERZ, 12 Respondent. 13 14 This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission 15 (Commission) on December 8, 2022, by telephonic and online streaming access. Respondent 16 Kurt S. Merz was provided notice on November 17, 2022 of the hearing date. The hearing was 17 held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 18 Commissioners present online were Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair (presiding); 19 and Commissioners William Downing, Allen Hayward, and Jocelyn Cooney. Also present 20 telephonically or online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the 21 Commission, Senior Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer and Assistant Attorney General 22 Susie Giles-Klein representing PDC Staff, and Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Officer. 23 Notice was provided to the Respondent and he did not appear on his own behalf. The Respondent 24 verbally provided information prior to the hearing which PDC staff relayed to the Commission. 25 The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

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The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated December 8, 2022, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Officer;
- 2. Hearing Notices, mailed and dated October 13, 2022, and November 17, 2022;
- 3. PDC Staff emails to Respondent dated October 27, 2022, and November 9, 2022;
- 4. Initial Order for prior violation, PDC Case 80221, entered January 11, 2021;
- 5. Signed Statement of Understanding, dated January 31, 2022.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent Kurt S. Merz, a School Director for the Wahkiakum School District 200. His current term began January 1, 2019. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2022, disclosing financial information for the calendar year 2021.

- 1. In March and April of 2022, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2021.
- 2. On October 13, 2022, PDC staff served the Respondent, by email and mail, with a hearing notice for an October 27, 2022, Adjudicative Proceeding (Enforcement hearing) before the full Public Disclosure Commission concerning Respondent's failure to file the F-1 report. The email was sent to the Respondent's personal and official email addresses.

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- 3. At the October 27, 2022, full Enforcement Hearing, this matter was brought before the Commission. The Respondent, who participated in the hearing by telephone, indicated his belief that he had already filed the report. The Commission continued the matter to allow the Respondent additional time to file his missing F-1 reports for 2019 and 2021 and asked PDC staff to continue his hearing to the following Commission meeting.
- 4. Between October 27, 2022, and November 9, 2022, several attempts to assist the Respondent in filing his reports were made by PDC staff. Compliance staff spoke to the Respondent by telephone on October 27, 2022 and sent him emails on October 27, 2022 and November 9, 2022. Filer Assistance staff left two voicemail messages and sent an email. None of the emails or messages were returned by the Respondent.
- 5. On November 17, 2022, PDC staff served the Respondent, by email and mail, with a hearing notice for a December 8, 2022 Adjudicative Proceeding (Enforcement Hearing) before the full Public Disclosure Commission continuing the previous month's hearing concerning the Respondent's failure to file the F-1 report. The email was sent to the Respondent's personal and official email addresses.
- 6. The Respondent filed the missing F-1 reports for 2019 and 2021 on December 7, 2022.
- 7. There are two prior cases for violation of RCW 42.17A.700:

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• PDC Case 80221. The Respondent served as a School Director for Wahkiakum School District 200 in 2020 and failed to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2019 that was due no later than April 15, 2020. At a December 17, 2020, Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$250 civil penalty in accordance with the penalty schedule in effect at the time. The \$250 penalty was paid but the report was not filed until December 7, 2022.

• PDC Case 102540. The Respondent served as School Director, and was a candidate for reelection for, Wahkiakum School District 200 in 2021 and failed to file a F-1 report for calendar year 2020, which was due no later than April 15, 2021. This case was resolved by the Respondent's submission of the missing F-1 report, payment of a reduced penalty, and a signed Statement of Understanding acknowledging a violation of RCW 42.17A.700.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
 42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

1	2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office
2	in 2021 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for
3	calendar year 2021 no later than April 15, 2022.
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5	/// III. ORDER
6	This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and
7	aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission
8	assesses a civil penalty of \$500 for the late filed calendar year 2021 F-1 Report.
9	assesses a civil penalty of \$500 for the fate filed calendar year 2021 1-1 Report.
10	1. The \$500 civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for
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12	calendar year 2021 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 shall be paid by the
13	Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
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15	2. If the Respondent fails to pay the civil penalty within 30 days of the date
16	of this order, the matter may be sent to collection or brought to Superior
17	Court as allowed by law without further action by the Commission.
