18		I.	FINDINGS OF FACT
19	This matter involves allegations the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.235 and RCW		
20	42.17A.240 by failing to file the required Cash Receipts Monetary Contribution (C-3) and		
21	Summary, Full Report Receipts and Expenditures (C-4) reports for political office in election

the Secretary of State's Office. The Respondent appeared on the primary election ballot but did not advance to the general election.

- 2. Respondent was a candidate in the 2022 primary election and paid a filing fee of \$568. Candidates in the 2022 election with expenditures of over \$200 were required to file an initial C-4 report. In addition, candidates on the ballot for the primary election in 2022 are required to file a C-4 report with the PDC 21 days and 7 days prior to the primary election regardless of contributions received or expenditures made. Respondent failed to file any of these three required reports.
- 3. No evidence was presented of contributions or expenditures by the Respondent's campaign in 2022 beyond the filing fee. C-3 reports are only required when contributions are received and do not include loans from the candidate to his own campaign.
- 4. Between January 3, and January 12, 2023, Respondent appeared at three different venues holding public meetings and declared his candidacy for public office. Specifically, the Respondent appeared and declared his candidacy at a meeting held before the Kirkland City Council on January 3, 2023, where he stated during the public comment period: "[m]y name Alex Tsimerman and I right now candidate for King County Bellevue Council 2023." The Respondent then attended and announced his candidacy on January 10, 2023, at a Port of Seattle Commission meeting stating: "[m]y name Alex Tsimerman I'm president of Standup America and I am a candidate right now for King County

District No. 6, 2023." The Respondent also declared his candidacy on January 12, 2023, at a public meeting of the Sound Transit Board where he stated: "[h]i my name Alex Tsimerman and I very appreciate you Council Balducci mention my name because I'm right now candidate for King County Council 23."

- 5. Beginning on or about the month of January, 2023, Respondent has maintained a campaign website which clearly identifies him as a "2023 Candidate for King County, Bellevue" on the landing page. On or about the month of May, 2023, Respondent updated his campaign's website landing page to specify the race he is running for: "2023 Bellevue City Council Position 3."
- 6. On April 28, 2023, PDC Staff received a complaint filed against the Respondent alleging that he had failed to timely file the required statutory C-3 and C-4 reports for election years 2022 and 2023.
- 7. On May 9, 2023, PDC Staff sent a copy of the complaint to the Respondent via email attachment and requested a response to the allegations outlined in the complaint by May 23, 2023. The Respondent did not respond to PDC Staff's inquiry.
- 8. On May 18, 2023, the Respondent filed his Declaration of Candidacy for Bellevue City Council, Position 3, with the Secretary of State's Office. The Respondent advanced to the general election and is currently a 2023 general election candidate.

17		opening a formal investigation for PDC Case No. 136406. Although the
18		Respondent was not required to appear, he was notified of the Initial Hearing
19		and did not appear.
20	12.	As of the date of the Commission hearing on September 28, 2023, Respondent
21		had not filed any of the required C-3 and C-4 reports for the 2022 or 2023
22		political campaigns.

- a. PDC Case 95308. Respondent was found to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) as a 2021 candidate for public office. The Respondent was assessed a civil penalty of \$250 with \$100 suspended under the condition that the report was filed and the non-suspended portion of the penalty was paid within 30 days of the date of the order issued on September 13, 2021. Respondent has not paid the \$250 civil penalty and has not filed the missing F-1 report for 2021.
- b. PDC Case 109529. The Respondent was found to have violated RCW 42.17A.205 and RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to timely file the required Candidate Registration (C-1 report) and Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) as a 2022 candidate for public office. The Respondent was assessed a civil penalty of \$1,000 pursuant to the Commission order dated August 11, 2022. Respondent has not paid the \$1,000 civil penalty or filed the missing C-1 and F-1 reports.
- c. PDC Case 120879. The Respondent was found to have violated RCW 42.17A.205 and RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to file the C-1 and F-1 reports within two weeks of becoming a candidate for the 2023 election year. The Respondent was assessed a civil penalty of \$5,000 with \$2,000 suspended, under the condition the reports were filed and the non-suspended portion of the penalty was paid within 30 days of the date the order was issued on May 4, 2023. The Respondent has not paid the \$5,000 civil penalty or filed the missing C-1 and F-1 reports.

- (c) Purchases commercial advertising space or broadcast time to promote the individual's candidacy; or
- (d) Gives consent to another person to take on behalf of the individual any of the actions in (a) or (c) of this subsection.
- 4. PDC enforcement staff did not present sufficient evidence of contributions or expenditures by Respondent's campaign to meet the agency's burden to show by a preponderance of evidence that filing of C-3 reports or monthly filings of C-4 filings were required in 2022 or 2023.

## III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Respondent is found to have violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 for failing to timely file three C-4 reports for the 2022 election. The 2022 reports were due after filing as a candidate, 21 days prior to the 2022 primary election, and 7 days prior to the 2022 primary election. Respondent is assessed a civil penalty of \$10,000 per violation (totaling \$30,000), with \$2,500 per violation suspended (totaling \$7,500) on the following conditions:

a. The non-suspended portion of \$7,500 per violation (totaling \$22,500), for failure to file the C-4 reports during the 2022 election year in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 and .240 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.

- b. The missing C-4 Reports due for the 2022 election year after becoming a candidate are filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
- c. The missing C-1 and F-1 reports due for election years 2021, 2022, and 2023, are filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order and the unpaid balance of the \$6,250 civil penalty, plus any collection costs, is paid within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
- d. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
- 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar year 2023 shall immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection or brought to Superior Court as allowed by law without further action by the Commission.
