

COMPLAINT TO THE PUBLIC DISCLOSURE COMMISSION

Pasco Citizens for Better Schools

RESPONDENTS:

Pasco Citizens for Better Schools. P.O. Box 4958, Pasco Washington 99302.

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

On October 11, 2017, Respondents filed a C1PC with the PDC and Registered a political Committee for the purposes of supporting Pasco School District's Proposition 1, a \$99.5 million School Bond scheduled for November 7, 2017. Pasco Citizens for Better Schools filed for “full reporting” which requires electronic filing of contributions and expenditures. See Exhibit 1.

As of this writing, Proposition 1 is losing by a margin of 6,221 (59.996%) to 4,148 (40.004%). Proposition 1, a bond measure, requires 60.0.% to be approved.

Despite maintaining a balance of \$6,934.69, (see Exhibit 3) Pasco Citizens for Better Schools is currently running a “crowdfunding” campaign to raise \$3,000 for a possible recount. See Exhibit 2.

The cost of the recount is \$3,000.00. See Exhibit 3.

As of this writing, Pasco Citizens for Better Schools crowdfunding has netted \$1,875. None of these contributions have been electronically reported to the PDC. The last reported contribution was on October 25, 2017. See Exhibit 4.

Pasco Citizens for Better Schools advises donors that “If the bond measure passes on its own without a recount, or if the funding goal of \$3,000 is not met, all donations will be set aside for future bond and levy campaigns.” Again, see Exhibit 2. The Pasco Citizens for Pasco Schools is raising contributions for a campaign which is beyond the scope of the C1PC filed with the PDC on October 11, 2017.

VIOLATIONS:

Funds contributed or the purposes of a specific measure, Proposition 1, the November 7, 2017 \$99.5 million bond can not be used for a future enumerated ballot measure.

What's the current state of the school bond election?

The approval rate of the school bond measure must reach a supermajority of 60% in order to be approved. The most recent preliminary result shows the approval rate at 59.996%—less than 1 vote short of a victory. The result is so close that the county website, which uses 2 significant digits for rounding, displays a misleading result of exactly 60%. It's impossible to predict what the final outcome of the election will be—the only thing we're sure of is that the margin will be razor thin.

Hasn't the voting deadline passed? Why is PCBS raising money now?

If the school bond fails, we have the option of filing for a manual recount within 2 days. Although recounts rarely change the outcomes of elections, they almost always differ slightly from the original count. The margin in this election is unprecedented, and a difference of just one or two votes could potentially change the outcome.

Ideally, we would wait until the final result is published before raising funds for a recount. However, as a political organization, we are only allowed to raise funds for upcoming elections; technically, this means we can raise funds until (but not after) the election is certified on November 28th. Once the election is certified and the final result is published, it would be too late for us to raise funds for a recount. Currently, PCBS does not have enough cash on hand to fund a manual recount.

How much would a recount cost?

A recount would cost approximately \$2,750 (\$0.25 per ballot times approximately 11,000 ballots). Since donations are being collected online, we also need to account for credit card processing fees, bringing the total to \$3,000.

Due to the cost involved, we've decided to crowdsource this decision. By choosing whether or not to donate to this crowdfunding campaign, Pasco residents will decide whether or not a manual recount should be requested if the bond measure fails. Our Facebook posts typically reach 6,000 people or more—if 5% of our audience donates at least \$10, we would have the funding necessary. PCBS will only file for a recount if (1) the final approval rate is below 60% and (2) the funding goal of \$3,000 is met.

What will PCBS do with the funds if a recount is not conducted?

If the bond measure passes on its own without a recount, or if the funding goal of \$3,000 is not met, all donations will be set aside for future bond and levy campaigns.

When we first met in September to discuss strategy for the current campaign, we had around \$3,000 in our bank account—the same amount we're hoping to raise today. Here's how we put that money to work:

- We ran a powerful social media campaign, including targeted paid advertising that reached nearly 30,000 Pasco residents.
- We printed thousands of flyers and assembled a team of over 80 volunteers to knock on doors and distribute them.
- We developed a mobile app to help volunteers coordinate their efforts and easily find registered voters.
- We printed and mailed 2,500 mailers to strategic households, which increased turnout among those households by approximately 4%.
- We placed dozens of signs in high-traffic areas around Pasco.

Pasco group collecting money for bond recount, if needed

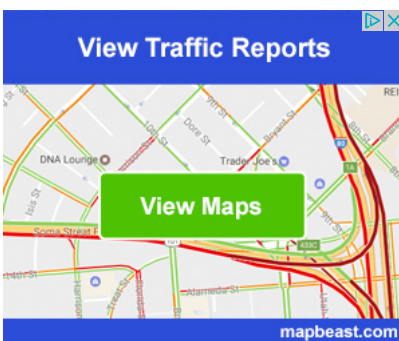

At least one side of the Pasco school bond is gearing up for a recount.

With 2017 election results being certified at 5 p.m. Tuesday, Pasco Citizens for Better Schools, which ran the “yes” campaign for the \$99.5 million bond, has raised more than \$1,800 in three days.

The group believes it will need about \$3,000 to pay Franklin County’s canvassing board for a recount of the 10,482 ballots cast on that issue the final count does not go their way.



As of Monday, the vote for the bond was 6,221, or 59.99 percent, and 4,148 against, or 40.01 percent. The final ballots will be counted Tuesday. The measure needs a flat 60 percent of all votes to pass.

Below I have included additional information related to the above complaint against Pasco Citizens for Better Schools filed November 27, 2017.

Proposition 1, Pasco School District's \$99.5 million bond, passed by 7 votes on November 28, 2017 when all elections were certified by the Franklin County Auditor. **Pasco Citizens for Better Schools did not seek a recount, or make any expenditures toward a recount. SEE EXHIBIT 1.**

Pasco Citizens for Better Schools collected \$2,285.00 in contributions for a recount. If a recount was not required, "all donations will be set aside for future bond and levy campaigns". **SEE EXHIBIT 2.** The purpose of the committee was to support the aforementioned bond floated on November 7, 2017, not "future bond and levy campaigns" (see Exhibit 1 from original complaint). As of this writing, **none of the \$2,285.00 collected was reported to the PDC.**

The website used for the crowdfunding campaign was www.pascobond.org. The website was purchased by David Jones, 6303 Burden Blvd., Pasco Washington 99301, (509) 845-4113 on September 16, 2017. **SEE EXHIBIT 3.**

The costs for the website, design and publishing were not reported on any expenditure report for any political committee, including Pasco Citizens for Better Schools. SEE EXHIBIT 4.

After an agonizing three weeks for supporters and opponents alike, it's official: the \$99.5 million bond to ease overcrowding in the Pasco School District has passed.

The margin was razor thin — about seven votes.

The bond needed 60 percent approval, and it ended up with 60.07 percent after the last ballots were counted Tuesday.

The bond went to a vote Nov. 7. The results have been a roller coaster leading up to Tuesday’s certification.

After the first count on election night, the measure was failing. It later gained ground and eventually pulled ahead by three votes.

Then, it fell behind again — failing by a single vote as of the Nov. 13 ballot count.

Since then, supporters and opponents have been waiting on tenterhooks for Tuesday’s final results.

Pasco Citizens for Better Schools, the community group that worked to promote the bond, raised more than \$2,200 in case it would need to request a recount.

"Good job everyone from the bond committee to everyone that ever said, 'Let's pass a bond this year!!!' and the one woman wrote.

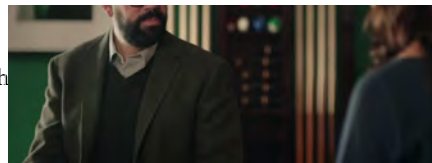
"This made me teary eyed. The kids and children deserve this!" wrote another.

Not everyone saw the results in the same light.

Roger Lenk, who led opposition to the bond, said the narrow margin shows the community's lack of trust in the district's spending.

"Kennewick and Richland (school district) voters overwhelmingly approve bonds, but Pasco voters do not, even though the need is known," he said.

"They really need to work on (their spending practices) if they want voters to overwhelmingly pass these kinds of measures."

Lenk said he doesn't plan to request a recount.

The school district proposed the bond to address overcrowding. It will pay for two new elementary schools, a new middle school and rebuilding Stevens Middle school, plus some other projects.

It will cost property owners an estimated 59 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value, or \$118 annually for a \$200,000 home.

The district has seen steady enrollment growth during the past decade, stretching capacity and stressing facilities.

As of October, it had more than 18,000 students — an increase of 37 percent over fall 2007.

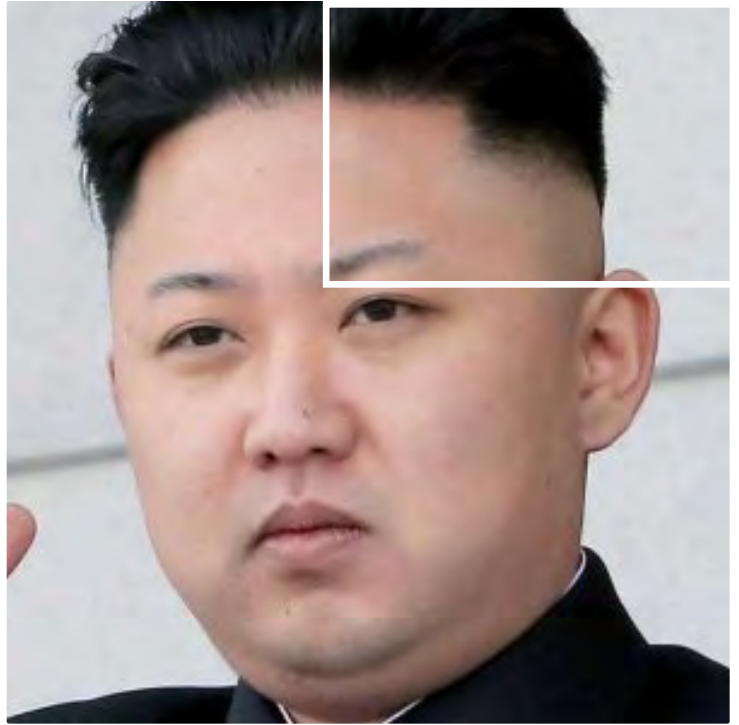
