Subject: Lance Gurel Enforcement Hearing Memorandum: PDC Case #141227

Allegations:

PDC staff alleges that Lance Gurel, a candidate in the 2020 election for State Representative, Legislative District 4 violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240, by failing to: (1) accurately identify monetary contributors; (2) disclose the candidate filing fee; and (3) include required descriptions for campaign expenditures.

Background:

- Lance Gurel was a candidate for State Representative, Legislative District 4 in the November 3, 2020, General Election and lost after receiving 37.74% of the vote.
- Mr. Gurel declared his candidacy for State Representative, Legislative District 4 on May 15, 2020.
- On January 16, 2020, Lance Gurel filed the Candidate Registration (C-1 report), selecting the "Full Reporting" option and listing Regan Glover as Treasurer. [Exhibit A]
- On August 10, 2023, PDC staff received a complaint filed by Glen Morgan alleging that Lance Gurel had violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240, by failing to: (1) accurately identify monetary contributors; (2) disclose the candidate filing fee; and (3) include required descriptions for campaign expenditures on Monetary Contribution reports (C-3 reports) and Summary Full Campaign Contribution and Expenditure reports (C-4 reports). [Exhibit B]
- PDC staff sent notice of the complaint to Mr. Gurel on August 18, 2023, and requested a response by September 1, 2023. [Exhibit C]

Lance Gurel August 21, 2024, Enforcement Hearing Memo PDC Case No. 143923 Page - 2 –

- After conducting a preliminary review and assessment of the complaint filed by Lance Gurel on August 10, 2023, PDC staff opened a formal investigation and held an Initial Hearing (Case Status Review Hearing) on November 8, 2023, pursuant to RCW 42.17A.755, and WACs 390-37-060 and 390-37-071. Mr. Gurel participated in the Initial Hearing. [Exhibit D]
- On April 8, 2024, staff resent the notice of complaint with correct attachments and requested all necessary amendments for the 2020 campaign to be completed by April 30, 2024. **[Exhibit E]**
- Mr. Gurel sent a response to staff on April 30, 2024, providing some details about the missing or incomplete reporting. [Exhibit F]
- On July 23, 2024, PDC staff served Lance Gurel by U.S. mail and electronic mail, with a hearing notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding to be held on August 29, 2024, concerning alleged violations of RCW 42.17A.235 and .240, by failing to: (1) accurately identify monetary contributors; (2) disclose the candidate filing fee; and (3) include required descriptions for campaign expenditures on C-3 and C-4 reports. [Exhibit G]

Laws & Rules:

RCW 42.17A.235 and RCW 42.17A.240 require candidates to file timely, accurate reports of contributions and expenditures. Under the "Full Reporting" option, until five months before the general election, C-3 and C-4 reports are required monthly when contributions exceed \$200* since the last report; on the twenty-first day and the seventh day preceding the date of the primary and general election date; and on the tenth day of the first month after the primary and general election date.

To whom it may concern,

It has recently come to my attention that Lance Gurel, during his failed 2020 campaign for the Washington State Legislature (4th LD) violated Washington State's campaign finance laws (**RCW 42.17A**). The details are as follows:

1) Failure to identify, or willfully conceal the true source of campaign contributions (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, .235, possibly Violation of RCW 42.17A.220 as well)

Washington State law clearly requires a political candidate to properly identify the true source of a contribution to their campaign (See **RCW 42.17A.240(2)).** This failed politician, however, on at least six occasions has attempted to conceal the true source of their contributions by attributing the source of funds to a payment aggregator (which is a corporate entity that aggregates payments to the final recipient of those funds). The specific violations are as follows:

- On October 14, 2020 \$200 contribution attributed falsely to "Act Blue" (See PDC Report #101007575, attached for Staff reference)
- On September 30, 2020 \$31.52 contribution falsely attributed to "Act Blue" (See PDC Report #101002532, attached for Staff reference)
- On September 23, 2020 \$28.57 contribution falsely attributed to "Act Blue" (See PDC Report #101000937, attached for Staff reference)
- On October 7, 2020 \$5.00 contribution falsely attributed to "Act Blue" (See PDC Report #101004121, attached for Staff reference)
- On September 29, 2020 \$5.00 contribution falsely attributed to "Act Blue" (See PDC Report #101002224, attached for Staff reference)
- On September 25, 2020 \$3.00 contribution falsely attributed to "Act Blue" (See PDC Report #101001143, attached for Staff reference)

Between the six of these contributions, falsely reported, it appears that at least \$297.99 of the contributions to this politician in 2020 were falsely reported to the public. In fact, this politician, it appears has concealed the true source of these funds for almost 4 years now. It seems appropriate that the veil of secrecy be lifted and the public be made aware the true source of these campaign contributions now – finally. Three years is more than enough time for the public to wait, and I'm fairly sure nobody can hold their breath any longer.

This politician must correct this illegal action. The treasurer must go back and properly identify and account for the true source of each contribution concealed by these aggregated false report. This would require refilling proper C3 reports reflecting the true source of the cash received. These steps should be taken immediately so that the public can know the truth about where this large volume of campaign cash truly came from.

By the way, when I reviewed every candidate who has used Act Blue in Washington State in the last 5 years as a payment aggregator, it appears that this candidate is the only one who attempted to conceal the true source of his campaign funds behind the façade of this payment aggregator (there was another candidate back in 2016, but that exceeds the statute of limitations for a complaint of this nature).

2) Total concealment of some expenditure information from the public (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, 42.17A.235)

Among other possible and likely violations and concealments, it appears this failed candidate clearly failed to report the filing fee for this office – which should be significant. There is no good reason to conceal this information from the public. Yet, this was concealed from the public regardless. For clarification of the need to report this expenditure, I've attached the relevant AGO (**AGO 1974:16 attached**) which clearly spells this requirement to report this expenditure as it applies in this case for even this failed politician.

3) Failure to accurately describe expense, and the illegal concealment of required information from the public. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, RCW 42.17A.235 & WAC 390-16-037)

Once I realized this politician would break the law with such carelessness and disregard for the truth, I realized it was far more likely that lawbreaking was a habit. So I started to look closer at this campaign. It turns out this campaign has failed to follow Washington State's Campaign Finance laws as they apply to the reporting of expenditures frequently. Here **are just five** specific examples of failing to detail how many campaign signs or mailers were purchased – A clear and explicit violation of WAC 390-16-037, Example B:

- On March 6, 2020 This candidate claims to have used vendor "Preferred Labor Signs" and reportedly spent \$2,175.50 on "Signs" but no amount given as clearly legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example B (See PDC Report #100967537, attached for Staff Reference).
- On **September 16**, **2020** This candidate claims to have used vendor "Preferred Labor Signs" and reportedly **spent \$1,115.10 on "Campaign Yard Signs"** but no amount

- given as clearly legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example B (See PDC Report #101002848, attached for Staff Reference).
- On April 14, 2020 This candidate claims to have used vendor "Preferred Labor Signs" and reportedly spent \$992.50 on "Yard Signs" but, again, no amount or number of signs provided despite being clearly legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example B (See PDC Report #100967538, attached for Staff Reference).
- On October 1, 2020 This candidate claims to have used vendor "Preferred Labor Signs" and reportedly spent \$822.45 on "Rack Cards" but, once again, no amount given despite being so clearly legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example B (See PDC Report #101006070, attached for Staff Reference).
- On June 19, 2020 This candidate claims to have used vendor "Preferred Labor Signs" and reportedly spent \$103.34 on "Postcards" but no amount given, despite how clearly this was legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example B (See PDC Report #100985629, attached for Staff Reference).
- To be fair to this campaign, the solution to this violation is at a minimum (in addition to whatever sanctions the PDC chooses to impose, this campaign must go back and correct all these legally deficient C3 reports. It may be three years late, but at least the truth can finally be known to the public. Truth denied or concealed for so long is bad enough, but at least it can finally be corrected by this lawbreaking crew.
- 4) Failure to list the vendor and the address of the vendor for in-kind contributions, therefore concealing from the public the true source of these contributions (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, RCW 42.17A.235)

When an individual or entity makes a donation of goods or services to a political committee so that the committee may attempt to sell these goods or services to others in exchange for money, this is an in-kind contribution.

I want to draw attention to the PDC's own website recommendations for how PACs and campaigns need to report this information.

Specifically, I want to draw attention to the PDC's specific requirements of reporting:

"In-kind donations that are not incidental **must** be fully reported in Part 1 of Schedule B to the C-4 with the following details: the date the contribution was received; the name and full address of the contributor; if the in-kind contribution is a good or service purchased from a vendor, include the name and address of the vendor; a brief description of the contribution; its fair market value; the cumulative total this contributor has given for the primary or general election, whichever applies; a designation whether this contribution is for the primary or general election; and if the contributor is an individual who has cumulatively given more than \$250 to the campaign,

including both primary and general contributions, identify the individual's employer (by name, city and state) and occupation."

This committee has failed to do this on numerous occasions over the past few years.

For both staff and the lawbreaker's reference, I will detail a handful of the deficient examples, so that the obvious lawbreaking can be hopefully corrected in the future to prevent the need to file additional maintenance and compliance complaints like this one:

- Violation Example #1 \$28.52 on 8/29/2020 (PDC C4 Report #100985629) for "campaign office supplies" donated by Lance Gurel. As the PDC rules so clearly state above, it is a legal requirement for this politician to report where the office supplies were purchased and the address of the original supplier of these office supplies. The public has a right to know, and this politician has a duty to report it, per PDC explicit rules quoted above.
- **Violation Example #2** On the same C4 as above \$36.15 on 7/13/2020, for "Tools and Items for Campaign Signs" donated by Lance Gurel. Again, as the PDC rules so clearly state above, it is a legal requirement for this politician to report where these tools and items for campaign signs were purchased and the address of the original supplier of these tools and items. The public has a right to know, and this politician has a duty to report it, per PDC explicit rules quoted above.
- Violation Example #3 \$437.50 on 5/02/2020 (PDC C4 Report #100974906) for "Purple Horizons Consulting" donated by Lance Gurel. Again, as the PDC rules so clearly state above, it is a legal requirement for this politician to report at least the address of this vendor and what type of consulting he thought he was buying.
- Violation Example #4 & #5 on the same C4 as above (PDC C4 Report #100974906) this politician didn't report the true source, vendor and address for fence posts, or "3inch buttons." Again, just failing to follow the law with nearly every in-kind report

I didn't attach a complete spreadsheet for these violations in this failed politician's campaign because while they are common, there do not appear to be more than 20, but, just like all the violations defined above, it appears necessary for this politician to go back and correct the record, get transparent, and get right with the public and report the truth to the PDC. It may have been three years since this campaign blew up and failed, but that doesn't mean they can't find the truth and finally report it for both the public and posterity to better understand what happened here.

Lance Gurel – A sad history of lawbreaking

I will note for the record, this politician does have a history of lawbreaking as evidenced in my last complaint filed against this politician in 2019, during his failed campaign for the Spokane Valley Council at the time (See **PDC Enforcement Case #57244, see Attached PDC Warning Letter**

and the Original Complaint I filed in that case for Staff Reference). While this politician got off easy with a weak "naughty, naughty" letter, he obviously decided to ignore the PDC's very generous attempt to give him a break, and he promptly broke the law less than a year after receiving that letter from the PDC. His past behavior and willingness to break the exact same laws less than a year later clearly indicates a lack of respect for the law and no concern about consequences if he continues to break it in the future.

Also, if politicians like this, as sloppy as they might have been in this case, are allowed to flagrantly disregard the law, then it will only encourage more lawbreaking in the future. Best to correct those who have broken the law right now in the hope (as vain as it might appear) that future politicians can learn from these lawbreaker's penalties and experiences.

A candidate for elective office who is required to pay a filing fee under RCW 29.18.050 must treat that fee as an expenditure under the campaign expenditure reporting requirements of Initiative No. 276.

Dear Sir:

By letter previously acknowledged the commission has requested our opinion on a question which we paraphrase as follows:

Must a candidate for elective office who is required to pay a filing fee under RCW 29.18.050 treat that fee as an expenditure under the campaign expenditure reporting requirements of Initiative No. 276?

We answer this question in the affirmative for the reasons set forth in our analysis.

ANALYSIS

Your question involves the campaign financing provisions of Initiative No. 276 (now codified as chapter 42.17 RCW), insofar as they relate to expenditures by candidates or [[Orig. Op. Page 2]] political committees. 1/

This new disclosure law, which was approved by the voters at the November, 1972, state general election, contains several provisions relating to the reporting of political campaign

expenditures. First, § 8 (now codified as RCW 42.17.080) provides that when a campaign treasurer is designated by a candidate or political committee there must be filed a "report of all contributions received and <u>expenditures made</u> in the election campaign prior to that date." (Emphasis supplied.) Then, RCW 42.17.090 (codifying § 9) sets out the general requirements for the reporting of such expenditures. Among the items of information that must be reported pursuant to this section are "the name and address of each person to whom an expenditure was made in the aggregate amount of \$25.00 or more, and the amount, date and purpose of each such expenditure." (RCW 42.17.090(1) (f).) Further, subsection (1)(g) of RCW 42.17.090 requires the continual reporting of the total sum of a candidate's campaign expenditures.

The term "expenditure" itself is defined in § 2 of the act (RCW 42.17.020(12)) as meaning:

"... a payment, contribution, subscription, distribution, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or anything of value, and includes a contract, promise, or agreement, [[Orig. Op. Page 3]] whether or not legally enforceable, to make an expenditure. The term 'expenditure' also includes a promise to pay, a payment or a transfer of anything of value in exchange for goods, services, property, facilities or anything of value for the purpose of assisting, benefiting or honoring any public official or candidate, or assisting in furthering or opposing any election campaign."

In other words, an expenditure, for the purposes of the act, includes any transfer or payment of anything of value which is made for the purpose of assisting a public official or candidate in furthering his election campaign. This leads us to your present question; i.e., whether the statutory filing fee provided for in RCW 29.18.050 constitutes such an "expenditure."

Insofar as is here material, this statute provides as follows:

"A fee of one dollar must accompany each declaration of candidacy for a precinct office without salary; a fee of ten dollars for any office with a compensation attached of one thousand dollars per annum or less; a fee equal to one percent of the annual compensation for any office with a compensation attached of more than one thousand dollars per annum."

The significance of this filing fee will readily be seen when the foregoing statute is read in conjunction with RCW 29.18.030, which provides that:

"The name of no candidate shall be printed upon the official ballot used at a state primary, unless not earlier than the last Monday of July nor later than the next succeeding Friday, a declaration of candidacy is filed in the form hereinafter set forth . . ."

Although situated in a chapter of the election code dealing with partisan primaries and elections, these two statutes (RCW 29.180.030 and 29.18.050) apply not only to elections for partisan offices but, as well, to elections for nonpartisan offices under chapter 29.21 RCW. See, RCW 29.21.020. In [[Orig. Op. Page 4]] AGO 1974 No. 12 [[to A. Ludlow Kramer, Secretary of State on June 28, 1974]], copy enclosed, however, we recently advised that the filing fee requirement of RCW 29.18.050 is no longer constitutionally enforceable, in view of a recent United States Supreme Court decision, in the case of indigent persons who are financially unable to pay the fee required for the particular office they are seeking.

With this exception, however, it is readily to be seen that for the purposes of the election law, a person seeking election to a particular office for which a filing fee is prescribed may not become an official candidate unless he has paid the required filing fee in conjunction with the filing of his

declaration of candidacy. From this it follows, in our opinion, that the filing fee <u>does</u> constitute an "expenditure," for the purposes of Initiative No. 276, in view of the definition contained in § 2 (RCW 42.17.020(12)), supra.

In simplest terms, this payment (in those cases in which it is required) is a necessary part of the candidate's financial outlay if he is to have his name appear on the ballot and, in that manner, become eligible to be elected to the office he is seeking. Moreover, the payment is very clearly a transfer of something of value and it cannot be doubted that it is for the purpose of assisting the candidate and furthering his election campaign. Payment of the filing fee is thus precisely within the broad definition of "expenditure" as set forth above. We must therefore answer your question, as above paraphrased, in the affirmative.

We trust the foregoing will be of assistance to you.

*** FOOTNOTES ***

<u>1</u>/The terms "candidate" and "political committee" are defined in RCW 42.17.020(5) and (22), respectively, as follows:

- "(5) 'Candidate' means any individual who seeks election to public office. An individual shall be deemed to seek election when he first:
- "(a) Receives contribution or makes expenditures or reserves space or facilities with intent to promote his candidacy for office; or
 - "(b) Announces publicly or files for office.

". . .

"(22) 'Political committee' means any person (except a candidate or an individual dealing with his own funds or property) having the expectation of receiving contributions or making expenditures in support of, or opposition to, any candidate or any ballot proposition."

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its review of the complaint you filed on September 9, 2019. The complaint alleged that Lance Gurel (Respondent), a candidate for City Council Member for City of Spokane Valley may have violated RCW 42.17A.235, .240 for failure to accurately file Summary Full Campaign Contribution and Expenditure reports (C-4 reports) disclosing details of expenditures undertaken by the Campaign; RCW 42.17A.320 for failure to include sponsor identification on political advertising; RCW 42.17A.445 for misuse of campaign funds for personal use.

PDC staff reviewed the allegations; the applicable statutes, rules, and reporting requirements; the responses provided by the Respondent; the applicable PDC reports filed by the Respondent; and queried the Respondent's data in the PDC contribution and expenditure database, to determine whether the record supports a finding of one or more violations.

Based on staff's review, we found the following:

- Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.235, .240 the Respondent is required to timely, completely, and accurately report contributions and expenditures undertaken by the campaign.
- The Respondent reported an expenditure of radio advertising without the sub-vendor information, run dates and times as per required by RCW 42.17A.240, WAC 390-16-037 and WAC 390-16-205 on C-4 report 100928567 filed September 6, 2019.
- On October 16, 2019, the Respondent filed amended C-4 report 100938708, to disclose the expenditure of \$1,005 to The Clark Company for KXLY AM Primary Election advertising that ran July to August.
- Pursuant to 42.17A.320 and WAC 390-18-010, the Respondent is required to include sponsor identification on political advertising, including the sponsor's name and address.
- The Respondent did not have the sponsor identification clearly identified on the front page of their social media page but added the sponsor identification to their social media site's front page in a readily visible location.
- Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.445 the candidate and candidate's authorized committee are not permitted to use campaign funds for personal use, unless otherwise enumerated.
- The Respondent disclosed an in-kind contribution of \$25, from Ashli Hoffman, for a haircut received on July 11, 2019, indicating that no campaign funds were expended.
- The Respondent is a first-time candidate, appearing on the August 6, 2019 Primary Election ballot and will appear on the November 6, 2019 General Election ballot.

• The Respondent has no prior violations of PDC laws or rules.

Based on our findings staff has determined that, in this instance for failure to accurately file Summary Full Campaign Contribution and Expenditure reports (C-4 reports) disclosing details of expenditures undertaken by the Campaign and failure to include sponsor identification on political advertising does not amount to a violation that warrants further investigation.

PDC staff is reminding Lance Gurel about the importance of the complete and accurate disclosure of all expenditure activities, as well as the full disclosure of sponsor identification on political advertising, and the importance of future timely, complete and accurate filings of all PDC reports and sponsor identification disclosures in accordance with the statutes and rules.

Based on this information, the PDC finds that no further action is warranted and has dismissed this matter in accordance with RCW 42.17A.755(1).

Complaint Description

Glen Morgan (Mon, 9 Sep 2019 at 2:32 PM)

To whom it may concern,

It has come to my attention that Lance Gurel, running for the Spokane Valley City Council, Position #3 has committed numerous violations of Washington State's campaign finance laws (RCW 42.17A).

1) Misuse of campaign funds for personal use (Violation of RCW 42.17A.445(2), WAC 390-16-238)

On at least two occasions campaign funds have been improperly used by this political campaign for the personal use and benefit of the candidate. In RCW 42.17A.445 (2), the law clearly states that campaign expenditures for the candidate or reimbursements can only be for campaign related expenses:

"Reimbursement for direct out-of-pocket election campaign and postelection campaign related expenses made by the individual."

Furthermore, WAC 390-16-238 provides even further more detailed guidance on this campaign finance issue. There are at least two examples as evidence of this. The first is the use of campaign funds to pay for a haircut of the candidate (See PDC Report # 100918583), an "in-kind" contribution of \$25 for a haircut to the candidate. This should not be reported on this candidates campaign documents, as it is something the candidate would purchase on their own regardless of whether they were running a campaign or not.

The second is the use of campaign funds to reimburse the candidate for purchasing pepper spray, (See PDC Report #100928567) presumably while the candidate is meeting constituents. While this candidate may only be planning to use chemical pepper spray on constituents dogs and pets (rather than on constituents with whom he politically disagrees), and he certainly has a right to carry pepper spray on his person at all times, it is certainly troubling to misuse political campaign funds to fund this expenditure. This is clearly an example of an expenditure which is more appropriate for the candidate to purchase for his own use and enjoyment. Claiming this is a legitimate campaign expenditure would be thin gruel for sure... At a minimum Candidate Gurel must reimburse this misuse of donor campaign funds.

2) Failure to accurately describe expense. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240(6) & WAC 390-16-037, RCW 42.17A.235)

Gurel's campaign has failed to follow Washington State's Campaign Finance laws as they apply to the reporting of expenditures.

Here is an example of a failure to provide sufficient detail of expenditures (unambiguous violations of RCW 42.17A.240(6) and WAC 390-16-037 (see example B provided at WAC 390-16-037(3)):

For example, the expenditures reported on PDC Report # 100928567 failed to report adequate details about "radio advertising" with the "Clark Company" on 8/13/19.

3) Failure to identify sponsor of Campaign Facebook Page (Violation of RCW 42.17A.320)

This candidate has also failed to properly identify the sponsor of a campaign Facebook Page website which his campaign apparently runs. See here for direct link: https://www.facebook.com/VoteLanceGurel/

Screen capture attached for current reference as well.

The PDC should conduct a thorough review of this campaign to identify other violations which may have been committed.

My apologies for the mistakes in my communication regarding the complaint filed against you in August 2023 by Glen Morgan. We had sent you the correct attachments but I failed to note that we had included an old complaint.

I have attached the correct complaint with the relevant attachments. I have also included a list below of the specific items that need attention. These were previously discussed but did not match the complaint you had received.

- 1. There are six contributions showing the donor as ActBlue. I am aware of this vendor and its business and believe these contributions were likely from a source other than ActBlue but were likely processed by them. Please amend your C-3 reports to include the source of these six donations. (See page 1 of the complaint for specific reports.)
- 2. The filing fee does not appear to have been reported. If the filing fee was reported or if there was no filing fee as expected, please provide the details in your reply.
- 3. There are expenditures made for political advertisements that require additional details. For example, expenditures for yard signs should include the number of signs printed. The same number of items should be included for rack cards and postcards. (See bottom of page 2 and top of page 3 of the complaint for report numbers.)

I request that you review the complaint and attachments along with the numbered items above. We have Filer Assistance staff available to assist you with your amendments, if you need help.

Please try to complete these amendments by the end of April. If you need help, have questions for me, or are unable to complete the amendments, please kindly send a reply to this email.

On the above date, the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) will hold a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) in accordance with RCW 42.17A.110 and RCW 42.17A.755, concerning the allegation that you violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240, by failing to: (1) accurately identify monetary contributors; (2) disclose the candidate filing fee; and (3) include required descriptions for campaign expenditures.

Under the Brief Enforcement Hearing rules, the Presiding Officer has the authority to assess a civil penalty in accordance with WAC 390-37-143, a penalty schedule adopted by the Commission (see enclosed copy).

You are not required by law to personally attend. However, the PDC recommends that respondents personally appear whenever possible.

Respondent and Complainant Notice Rights:

In accordance with WAC 390-37-060(5), the respondent and complainant are being provided notice 10 days in advance of the hearing. In accordance with WAC 390-37-030, the complainant does not have special standing to intervene in the hearing but may be called as a witness at the discretion of PDC staff. The Presiding Officer has the discretion to allow comment by a person other than the respondent during their consideration of the complaint. Any person who wishes to comment should notify staff at least three business days before the proceeding.

WAC 390-37-030 allows the complainant or any other person to submit documentary evidence and/or written factual or legal statements to the staff at any time up to and including the fifth calendar day before the date of any enforcement hearing or proceeding.

If there are materials you wish to have considered at the Brief Enforcement Hearing, you may attend the hearing in person, participate by telephone, remotely or submit written materials addressed to the Presiding Officer. Any written materials you choose to provide in advance of the Brief Enforcement Hearing should describe the facts of your case and any circumstances or mitigating factors you would like the Presiding Officer to consider. Please submit your written response so it is received by no later than 5 p.m. August 22, 2024.

BRIEF ENFORCEMENT HEARINGS – INFORMATION FOR FILERS

You have received a letter or email from the PDC scheduling a Brief Enforcement Hearing before a PDC Commissioner. Here are the answers to some Frequently Asked Questions about these brief hearings. This FAQ is informational only and should not be considered legal advice.

What is a Brief Enforcement Hearing?

The PDC is responsible for enforcing the State's campaign finance laws. We may schedule what is called a Brief Enforcement Hearing (also known as a "Brief Adjudicative Proceeding" under the Administrative Procedure Act) to address compliance with campaign finance reporting requirements when evidence shows the following types of alleged violations may have occurred:

- Failure to file or timely file required reports of financial affairs, campaign contributions and/or expenditures, independent expenditures, or funds spent on lobbying;
- Improper use of public facilities or resources in election campaigns when the value of public funds expended or facilities used was minimal; and
- Infractions of political advertising laws regarding sponsor identification or political party identification.

Brief Enforcement Hearings may be scheduled on other matters as well, if the basic facts are agreed to or are not being contested, and it is anticipated that the likely penalty imposed (if a violation is found) will be \$1,000 or less. The Commission has adopted a penalty schedule for Brief Enforcement Hearings which can be found in the Washington Administrative Code WAC 390-37-143.

A Presiding Officer, who is a PDC Commissioner, will conduct the hearing. PDC Staff will present the case to the Presiding Officer, and you will have an opportunity to explain the circumstances related to the alleged violations. You may do this in person, by telephone, or in writing by email or letter.

Who are the parties involved?

The PDC Staff initiates and investigates possible violations, and brings cases forward to the Commission or its Presiding Officer. The person who is alleged to be out of compliance with the law is referred to as the "Respondent."

What do I do to prepare for the hearing?

The brief hearings are informal in nature. You are not required to have an attorney for this hearing. Hearings take place in the PDC meeting room where Commission meetings are held. You need to let the staff know at least <u>five</u> business days before the hearing whether you will be participating in-person or by phone, or prefer not to participate.

If you are having other people (witnesses) testify on your behalf, they must be available at the hearing, and staff needs to be informed of the number of witnesses and time needed for their testimony when you notify the staff of your participation. The scheduled hearing starting time is the start time for several matters that will be heard by the Presiding Officer, and your case may not be the first one heard. So you will need to remain available to participate until your case is called.

Waiving your right to participate. If you have submitted nothing in writing prior to the hearing, have made no other arrangements, and you do not appear in person, by phone, or through your legal counsel at the hearing, it will be presumed that you have decided to waive your right to participate at the hearing.

What happens at the hearing?

The Presiding Officer will introduce the participants and explain the procedure for the hearing. The hearing will be audio-taped.

The Presiding Officer will swear-in PDC Staff for them to present information regarding the alleged violation of law. You will then have an opportunity to testify, which is your opportunity to present information. All testimony by staff, Respondents, and witnesses is given under oath, but at a regular meeting table or online, not in a courtroom. The Presiding Officer may ask you some questions about the information you, PDC Staff, or witnesses have presented. If you have decided to participate in writing instead of in person or by phone, your written information will be considered by the Presiding Officer as part of the hearing materials.

If at any time the Presiding Officer believes the alleged violations are serious enough to merit penalties greater than \$1,000, the Presiding Officer will adjourn the hearing and direct that the matter be scheduled for a hearing before the full Commission at a later time.

How is the decision made?

After considering all the information presented at the hearing, the Presiding Officer will make a decision about the allegation(s) and any appropriate penalty amount. The decision is typically announced orally at the hearing.

The Presiding Officer will use the penalty schedule referred to above that has been adopted by the Commission in rule to determine the appropriate penalty for certain types of violations, taking into account aggravating and mitigating factors. The penalty schedule is below.

What happens after my hearing?

A written decision, called an Initial Order, laying out the Presiding Officer's ruling, including the findings and the penalty, will be sent to you. The PDC tries to get orders issued within 10 days if possible, and not later than 30 days. If a monetary penalty is imposed in the Initial Order, the penalty must be paid to the **Washington State Treasurer**, and mailed to the address listed in the Order cover letter within the time frame stated in the Order.

Along with your Initial Order, you will also receive information about your appeal rights, including how to request review or reconsideration by the full Commission if you disagree with the Initial Order. Follow these procedures carefully if you wish to appeal. If there is no appeal before the PDC, the Initial Order becomes a Final Order, and further appeals must be made in Superior Court.

What are the rules that apply to the procedures of my hearing?

The PDC's laws and rules are available on the PDC's website at www.pdc.wa.gov. The laws are in the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) Chapter 42.17A. The rules are in the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) Title 390. Brief Adjudicative Proceedings are described at WAC 390-37-140 through 390-37-150 and in the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) at RCW 34.05.482-494.

Penalty Schedule [WAC 390-37-143]:

The Presiding Officer may assess a penalty up to one thousand dollars upon finding a violation of chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC.

- "Occasion" means established violation. Only violations in the last five years will be considered for the purpose of determining second and third occasions.
- (2) In determining the appropriate penalty, the presiding officer may consider the nature of the violation and aggravating and mitigating factors, including:
- (a) Whether the respondent is a first-time filer;
- (b) The respondent's compliance history for the last five years, including whether the noncompliance was isolated or limited in nature, indicative of systematic or ongoing problems, or part of a pattern of violations by the respondent, or in the case of a political committee or other entity, part of a pattern of violations by the respondent's officers, staff, principal decision makers, consultants, or sponsoring organization;
- (c) The respondent's unpaid penalties from a previous enforcement action;
- (d) The impact on the public, including whether the noncompliance deprived the public of timely or accurate information during a time-sensitive period, or otherwise had a significant or material impact on the public;

- (e) The amount of financial activity by the respondent during the statement period or election cycle;
- (f) Whether the late or unreported activity was significant in amount or duration under the circumstances, including in proportion to the total amount of expenditures by the respondent in the campaign or statement period;
- (g) Corrective action or other remedial measures initiated by respondent prior to enforcement action, or promptly taken when noncompliance brought to respondent's attention;
- (h) Good faith efforts to comply, including consultation with PDC staff prior to initiation of enforcement action and cooperation with PDC staff during enforcement action, and a demonstrated wish to acknowledge and take responsibility for the violation;
- (i) Personal emergency or illness of the respondent or member of his or her immediate family;
- (j) Other emergencies such as fire, flood, or utility failure preventing filing;
- (k) Sophistication of respondent or the financing, staffing, or size of the respondent's campaign or organization; and
- (l) PDC staff, third-party vendor, or equipment error, including technical problems at the agency preventing or delaying electronic filing.
- (3) The presiding officer has authority to suspend all or a portion of an assessed penalty under the conditions to be determined by that officer including, but not limited to, payment of the nonsuspended portion of the penalty within five business days of the date of the entry of the order in that case.
- (4) If, on the third occasion, a respondent has outstanding penalties or judgments, the matter will be directed to the full commission for consideration.
- (5) The presiding officer may direct a matter to the full commission if the officer believes one thousand dollars would be an insufficient penalty or the matter warrants consideration by the full commission. Cases will automatically be scheduled before the full commission for an enforcement action when the respondent:
- (a) Was found in violation during a previous reporting period;
- (b) The violation remains in effect following any appeals; and
- (c) The person has not filed the disclosure forms that were the subject of the prior violation at the time the current hearing notice is being sent.
