Subject: Question PAC Enforcement Hearing Memorandum: PDC Case #141456

Allegations:

PDC staff alleges that Question PAC, a continuing political action committee (PAC) registered with the PDC, violated: (1) RCW 42.17A.235 & .240 for failure to timely and accurately file Monetary Contribution reports (C-3 reports) and Summary Full Campaign Contribution and Expenditure reports (C-4 reports), disclosing contributions and expenditures undertaken by the Campaign as required when registered under the “Full Reporting” option; (2) RCW 42.17A.260 for failure to timely and accurately file Independent Expenditure reports (C-6 reports); (3) RCW 42.17A.265 for failure to timely disclose Last Minute Contributions (LMCs); and (4) WAC 390-16-011A for failure to include the sponsor name of the PAC on a Political Committee Registration Statement (C-1PC report).

Background:

- Question PAC has been registered with the PDC as a political action committee since at least 2018, submitting a C-1PC report on June 4, 2018, selecting the “Full Reporting” option and listing Charles E. Wiegand as Campaign Manager and Treasurer. **[Exhibit A]**
- On August 16, 2023, PDC staff received a complaint filed by Glen Morgan alleging that Question PAC had violated (1) RCW 42.17A.235 & .240 for failure to timely and accurately file C-3 reports and C-4 reports, disclosing contributions and expenditures undertaken by the Campaign; and (2) WAC 390-16-011A for failure to include the sponsor’s name on the C-1PC report. **[Exhibit B]**
- On August 19, 2023, PDC staff received a supplemental complaint from Glen Morgan adding allegations of: (1) RCW 42.17A.260 for failure to timely and accurately file C-6 reports; and (2) RCW 42.17A.265 for failure to timely disclose LMC’s. **[Exhibit B]**

- PDC staff sent notice of the initial complaint to the Respondent August 25, 2023, and notice of the supplemental complaint on August 29, 2023.
- Mr. Wiegand responded on behalf of the Respondent to the complaints on November 5, 2023. **[Exhibit C]**
- Question PAC submitted a C-4 report covering December 1 to 31, 2020, disclosing an ending balance of \$15,530.82 in total contributions received and \$9,078.58 in total expenditures during calendar year 2020.
- The first C-4 reports submitted by the Respondent disclosed \$1,734.78 in expenditures occurring during the month of January 2021, with no carry forward balance. The C-4 reports submitted for February, March and April 2021, disclosed expenditures of \$31.38 for each month, and \$219.38 for May 2021. The May 2021 C-4 report filed on June 4, 2021, ended with a negative cash on hand balance of -\$2,048.30 and was the last submitted by the Respondent to date.
- Sixty days prior to the November 3, 2020, general election Question PAC disclosed \$10,844.22 in total contributions with more than 92% of the total attributed to committee officer Charles Wiegand.
- On November 1, 2019, the Respondent disclosed the receipt of a \$3,000 in-kind contribution from Charles Wiegand made on October 1, 2019. No Last Minute Contribution (LMCs) reports were submitted.
- After conducting a preliminary review and assessment of the complaints filed by Glen Morgan on August 25 and 29, 2023, PDC staff opened a formal investigation and held an Initial Hearing (Case Status Review Hearing) on November 15, 2023, pursuant to RCW 42.17A.755, and WACs 390-37-060 and 390-37-071. Charles Wiegand participated in the Initial Hearing on behalf of Question PAC. **[Exhibit D]**
- On March 27, 2024, PDC staff served Question PAC and Charles Wiegand as the solely disclosed committee officer, by U.S. mail and electronic mail, with a hearing notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding to be held on May 2, 2024, concerning alleged violations of: (1) RCW 42.17A.235 & .240 for failure to timely and accurately file C-3 and C-4 reports, disclosing contributions and expenditures undertaken by the Campaign as required when registered under the “Full Reporting” option; (2) RCW 42.17A.260 for failure to timely and accurately file C-6 reports; (3) RCW 42.17A.265 for failure to timely disclose LMCs; and (4) WAC 390-16-011A for failure to include the sponsor name of the PAC on a C-1PC report. **[Exhibit E]**

Laws & Rules:

[RCW 42.17A.235](#) and [RCW 42.17A.240](#) require political committees to file timely, accurate reports of contributions and expenditures. Under the “Full Reporting” option, until five months before the general election, C-3 and C-4 reports are required monthly when contributions exceed \$200 since the last report; on the twenty-first day and the seventh day preceding the date of the primary and general election date; and on the tenth day of the first month after the primary and general election date.

[RCW 42.17A.260](#) requires, in part, sponsors of political advertising to submit a C-6 report within twenty-four hours of, or on the first working day after, the date the political advertising is first published, mailed, or otherwise presented to the public, if the ad meet the criteria specifically described in statute.

[RCW 42.17A.265](#) requires, in relevant part, that political committees submit to the commission a special report when a contribution of \$1,000 or more in the aggregate is received and when a contribution of \$1,000 or more in the aggregate is made.

[WAC 390-16-011A](#) requires a “sponsored political committee” to include the name of at least one sponsor in the committee’s name as disclosed on the C-1pc and that the C-1pc must be amended sixty days before an election in which it participates if the name does not already include the sponsor. The rule further states that for purposes of determining whether a political committee is sponsored, as defined in RCW [42.17A.005](#), by having received eighty percent or more of its contributions from a person or from the person's members, officers, employees, or shareholders, the political committee organized to support or oppose a particular candidate or ballot proposition must consider all contributions received by the committee in the previous twelve months.

<p>Glen Morgan</p> <p>Wed, 16 Aug 2023 at 7:47 PM</p> <p>To whom it may concern,</p> <p>It has recently come to my attention that the Question Political Action Committee has violated Washington State’s campaign finance laws (RCW 42.17A). The details are as follows:</p> <p>1) Failure to identify, or willfully conceal the true source of PAC contributions (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, .235, possibly Violation of RCW 42.17A.220 as well)</p> <p>Washington State law clearly requires a PAC to properly identify the true source of a contribution to their campaign (See RCW 42.17A.240(2)). This PAC, however, on at least one occasion has attempted to conceal the true source of their contributions by attributing the source of funds to a payment aggregator (which is a corporate entity that aggregates payments to the final recipient of those funds). The specific violations are as follows:</p> <p>On Oct 21, 2021 - \$2,276.60 contribution attributed falsely to “PayPal” (See PDC Report #110004719, attached for Staff reference)</p> <p>This contribution, falsely reported, it appears that at least \$2,276.60 of the contributions to this PAC in 2021 were falsely reported to the public. In fact, this PAC, it appears has concealed the true source of these funds for years now.</p> <p>This PAC must correct this illegal action. There are only two options (in addition to sanctions imposed by the PDC). The first option would be for the treasurer to go back and properly identify and account for the true source of each contribution concealed by this aggregated false report. This would require refilling proper C3 reports reflecting the true source of the cash received. The second option would be to recognize this is essentially illegal overlimit anonymous contributions, and forfeit \$2,276.60 to the State of Washington for the illegal overlimit contributions (See RCW 42.17A.220).</p> <p>Regardless of which path this PAC takes to correct the illegal violations of Washington State Campaign finance laws, these steps should be taken immediately so that the public can know the truth about where this large volume of campaign cash truly came from.</p>

2) Failure to accurately describe expense, and the illegal concealment of required information from the public. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, RCW 42.17A.235 & WAC 390-16-037)

Once I realized this PAC would so egregiously violate the law with such carelessness, I started to look closer. It turns out this weird PAC has failed to follow Washington State's Campaign Finance laws as they apply to the reporting of expenditures frequently (of course). Here are a few specific examples of failing to follow the law. These are clear and explicit violation of WAC 390-16-037, Example B:

On January 8, 2021 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “SMG Spokane” and reportedly spent \$1,703.40 – on “Advertising” but no clarification or specifics (what type of advertising? How many advertising events or ads? Over what period of time was the advertising run? This is clearly legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #110017328, attached for Staff Reference).

On October 1, 2020 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “Google” and reportedly spent \$222.29 on “google advertisements” but no clarification or specifics (how many advertisements? Over what time? Where did the ads run? Was it YouTube? This is legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #110000203, attached for Staff Reference).

On July 16, 2019 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “Twitter” and reportedly spent \$268.48 on nebulous “advertising” but consistent with the law breaking pattern of behavior no clarification or specifics provided (how many ads? Over what period of time? What was the reach? Much of this data is provided by these advertising vendors). Again, this is legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #100936628, attached for Staff Reference)

On September 16, 2019 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “Facebook” and reportedly spent \$84.95 on nebulous “advertising” again, but no clarification or specifics provided (how many ads? Over what period of time? What was the reach? Much of this data is provided by these advertising vendors as I've already stated). Again, this is legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #100936630, attached for Staff Reference)

On June 17, 2019 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “Facebook” and reportedly spent \$84.95 on nebulous “advertising” again, but no clarification or specifics provided (how many ads? Over what period of time? What was the reach? Much of this data is provided by these advertising vendors as I've already stated). Again, this is legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #100936627, attached for Staff Reference)

On August 30, 2019 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “Twitter” again, and reportedly spent \$55.04 on nebulous “advertising” but consistent with the law breaking pattern of behavior of this PAC, no clarification or specifics provided (how many ads? Over what period of time? What was the reach? Much of this data is provided by these advertising vendors). Again, this is legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #100936629, attached for Staff Reference)

On November 1, 2018 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “Facebook” and reportedly spent \$750.00 on nebulous “advertising” again, but no clarification or specifics provided

(how many ads? Over what period of time? What was the reach? Much of this data is provided by these advertising vendors as I've already stated). Again, this is legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #100936277, attached for Staff Reference)

On September 10, 2018 & also on September 17, 2018– This PAC claims to have used vendor “Facebook” and reportedly spent \$500.00 and then \$389.27 on nebulous “advertising” again, but no clarification or specifics provided (how many ads? Over what period of time? What was the reach? Much of this data is provided by these advertising vendors as I've already stated). Again, this is legally required and specified in WAC 390-16-037, example A (See PDC Report #100936274, attached for Staff Reference)

Again, these are not the only violations this PAC has committed in breaking this specific law, but it is a good starting point for where this PAC needs to go back and at a minimum (in addition to sanctions from the PDC) go back and correct the record for public transparency. It is odd that they chose to conceal this information from the public for so many years now.

3) Failure to properly identify as a sponsored committee (Violation of RCW 42.17A.005(47)(b)(i), WAC 390-16-011A)

This Secretive, Dark Money PAC raises a lot of questions, which is appropriate for the name “Question PAC”, but it clearly received more than 80% of its funding sourced from one primary sponsor source in 2019, for example. That year, the primary sponsor was Charles Wiegand (See PDC C3 Report # 100945745 attached - \$3,000 in-kind contribution, also PDC C3 Report #100945747 attached - \$500 cash contribution). In addition, it appears an unrepaid (and therefore an unreported in-kind contribution from the 2018 version of this PAC of \$5,000 from Charles Wiegand (See PDC C3 Report#100853898, attached for reference) So, to be fair, during the 2019 calendar year, over \$8,513 was reported from Charles to be in this PAC in 2019, and that year, the PAC only raised \$1300, so this was really the Charles Wiegand show. If there had been any interest in complying with the law, this sponsored PAC should have corrected their C1PC and renamed themselves the “Question PAC, sponsored by Charles Wiegand” but, obviously there was no attempt by this professional, well-funded PAC to follow the law.

The law is very clear, as WAC 390-16-011A clearly states:

“A sponsored political committee must amend its C-1pc sixty days before an election in which it participates if the committee's name on its most recently filed C-1pc does not include at least one current sponsor.”

This political committee failed to comply with the law and correct its C1PC documents to properly reflect that it was a wholly sponsored PAC with most of its funding coming from one guy. This was a flagrant effort to conceal the truth, and it should be corrected now.

4) Attempt to conceal address of vendors and other critical information (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240)

Repeatedly, on many C4 reports, including many of them already attached for some of the above examples of lawbreaking, this weird PAC didn't bother to provide vendor addresses as so clearly is required by the statute. So, this guy needs to go back and fix this on all their past C4s, which seems like a common problem.

I've gotten bored with this one, so I'm going to shift to a PAC or politician who is a bit more interesting, but I'm sure there are additional violations I didn't notice. I trust PDC staff to do their usual thorough review of this PAC and catch the violations I missed in my original, rough draft review.

<p>Glen Morgan</p> <p>Sat, 19 Aug 2023 at 11:04 AM</p> <p>To whom it may concern,</p> <p>After consideration, I reviewed a recent complaint I filed against Question PAC on August 16th, and I realized that there were actually a number of additional violations which I failed to detail in my original complaint where this exceptionally shady dark money PAC appears to have violated Washington State's campaign finance laws (RCW 42.17A). The details on these violations are as follows:</p> <p>1) Complete and total failure to timely file any C-6 reports during the entirety of the existence of this shady crew (Violation of RCW 42.17A.260, RCW 42.17A.305)</p> <p>In my original complaint filed against this shady Dark Money crew on August 16th, I detailed violations associated with a failure to identify as a sponsored committee (Violation of RCW 42.17A.005(47)(b)(i), WAC 390-16-011A), concealment of true source of funding (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, RCW 42.17A.240), failure to provide legally required details on advertising and other expenditures (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, WAC 390-16-037), and a failure to provide legally required information about vendors (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240).</p> <p>I think I processed this original complaint in a hurry, so I really missed a bunch of other, possibly more significant problems with this shady dark money PAC, and my original sloppiness and lack of thorough review caused me to lose sleep, so I thought I would go back and correct my original lack of thoroughness, and provide additional clarity on the myriad of violations that this PAC appears to have committed during the handful of years it has lurked on the scene. Frankly, groups like this and their dishonest activities are exactly why we have our state's campaign finance laws in the first place.</p> <p>In this specific allegation, I want to point out that this crew only filed one C-6 during it's entire existence (See PDC Report #C6-9861, attached for staff reference). Please note this was filed a month late – essentially after the election was over and a month after the ads paid for were run. Again, as I noted in my last complaint, just like in every report this group has filed, it is also lacking the legally required details for the public (WAC 390-16-037, Example B, again).</p>

However, it also appears, based on this PAC's limited and mostly illegal filings with the PDC, they would have been required to file a number of C-6 reports, which it never did. This crew, in addition to addressing the many violations I have already outlined, clearly needs to go back and correct this illegal action and refile those missing reports, even if they are years late now.

2) Concealment of expenditures and/or contributions from the public (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, RCW 42.17A.235)

Another odd feature of this PAC and its sordid history was the fact that while it didn't file any C4 reports in the last few years, the last one it did file was on June 4, 2021 (See PDC C-4 Report #110023003 attached for staff reference), and it shows a negative balance of \$2,048.30, which doesn't really add up. First of all, line 18 of this report should match the bank account balance at the time of the report (it obviously doesn't). Secondly, this PAC is still collecting donations at their website, see below (and if they take it down to conceal this fact, I've also included a screen capture from 8/19/2023 that shows they are still taking cash donations):

Expenditures have been continuing to incur for this PAC since its last C4 – judging from the website postings and the fact that someone is paying for the website itself over the past few years, but nothing has been reported. This Dark Money PAC has gone Full Dark and into the shadows as it attempts to conceal everything from the public at this time.

3) Failure to file a Last Minute Contribution report for over a year (Violation of RCW 42.17A.265)

As clearly defined and explained in RCW 42.17A.265, any last-minute contributions over \$1,000 during a special reporting period around an election requires the Pac to file a Last Minute Contribution Report, which this PAC failed to do with at least one \$1,000 contribution by “United Food and Commercial” on 10/18/18. When they did finally report it on 9/23/19 (See PDC C-3 Tracking #100932806, attached for staff reference) it was 327 days late.

There was no attempt by this PAC to even pretend to follow the law on this one.

4). Attempt to conceal everything from the public (contributions and expenditures) so that the public never finds out what this group is doing. Habitual late reporting (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, RCW 42.17A.240)

As has been my practice lately, I'm attempting to quantify the egregious nature of late reporting by some of these secretive PACs who have zero interest in complying with the law and appear to be strategically concealing the truth from the public. This Question PAC has a

lot of questionable behavior, but his late reporting should be considered part of the problem here. Most of the funds raised and spent by this PAC were reported very late, if they were reported at all. See the attached spreadsheet (and PDF file) for the details of these late reports.

For ease of staff review, I have color coded the most egregious late filings by this secretive PAC in red (there were 54 of these – which is most of their filings), and the Problematic late reports in orange (there were 11 of these), and the Sloppily reported documents in yellow (there were 6 of these). Generally, this list just demonstrates a widespread effort to conceal the truth from the public for many months in most cases. The public had no idea what this secretive dark money crew was up to during the elections when it influenced the public and attempted to influence the outcome of the elections.

As always, for ease of staff reference, I have also attached direct links in the far-right hand column so that Staff can verify each late report and check the data used to compile this list.

5) Total Failure to identify the candidates in favor/support for the advertising (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, RCW 42.17A.260, RCW 42.17A.305)

This is related to the failure to file C-6 reports detailed above, but it merits pointing out that most of the advertising referenced by this PAC (and this is most of what they appear to have done), failed to identify which candidates they were supporting or opposing. I've provided a spreadsheet list of these expenditures with direct links in the right-hand column to the original reports so that staff can verify this fact for yourself.

While I already called out the fact this PAC didn't provide details or vendor addresses, etc, I wanted to be clear that they pretty much never complied with the law in identifying who they were supporting or opposing. I hope this attached report (in both Excel and in PDF format) can assist staff in this process.

6) Failure to properly identify the actual vendor who performed the video editing services (and it wasn't PayPal) (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240)

While I addressed this somewhat in my complaint from three days ago, I wanted to add further detail to my concerns regarding using straw identities to camouflage true source of funding, and also vendors. Ten different itemized expenditures were made to "PayPal" for "video editing", but that is not what the payment processor PayPal does as business. Instead, this misidentification was done to conceal the true vendor for the video editing.

Six of these payments were reported on a C4 filed on 8/14/2020 (See PDC Report #100991894 attached for staff reference), and another three were reported on a C4 filed on 9/3/2020 (See PDC Report #100995564 attached for staff reference), and one was reported on a C4 filed on 10/9/2020 (See PDC Report #101004237, attached for staff reference). Obviously, these are all fake, illegal reports concealing the true identity of the video editing vendor/vendors used by this shady PAC.

I feel like this updated complaint adds more details that I missed in my original complaint against this shady PAC crew a few days ago. It probably makes sense to combine them into one investigation. This group really looks like a total mess with no effort to even pretend to follow the law. Unraveling this will not be easy. Probably subpoenas for bank records would be a good idea just to see how far off and inaccurate the reporting for this entity really was.

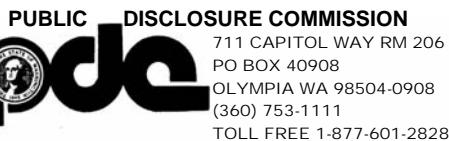

Response to Complaint

Alleged violation of RCW 42.17A.235 & RCW 42.17A.240

Summary

As the Treasurer of Question PAC, I have reviewed the initial complaint and although I disagree with its broader conclusions, I did find it necessary to amend and re-file several reports with the Public Disclosure Commission (the "PDC").

I appreciate the diligent effort put forth by the complainant Glen Morgan in reviewing the financial history of this PAC, and in response to his work, our PAC will be filing and/or amending reports with the PDC that will bring it largely in compliance with state election law.

Question PAC is tiny and has limited resources. Upon receiving the complaint, we became eager to achieve compliance with the PDC's filing and disclosure requirements. Starting a locally operated PAC from scratch involves a steep learning curve involving several complex processes, and we are striving to engage in political activity in a way that satisfies Washington State Law.

Our team reviewed every transaction and if necessary, will be filing and/or amending every report from the founding of the PAC with the PDC.

The Online Reporting Of Campaign Activity (ORCA) filing system for Question PAC lacked many of the transactions in the system that was previously entered by our accounting team.

I contacted the PDC help line and spoke with an agent named Scott (who was extremely helpful), and he advised us that he could have the PDC IT services look into restoring the data. Scott advised that I could NOT be assured that the data could be restored. I declined to have PDC IT services work on restoring the data, and instead decided that we would manually enter all the data again into ORCA.

We are currently working on this, and once re-entered, we will re-file the C-3s and C-4s. We will be advising PDC (per the PDC agent Scott) to amend the C-3 filings with the new data as entered.

As for the independent expenditures made by our PAC, most of these were dedicated to either a) general fundraising, publicity, or volunteer advertising, or b) for federal elections and were not related to any state, local or WA judicial candidates.

A response to the first complaint is presented in three sections below. The original numbering of the details of the complaint mirror those used in the three sections of the responses.

Responses to the Details of the Complaint

1) Failure to identify, or willfully conceal the true source of PAC contributions.

Complaint States “On Oct 21, 2021 - \$2,276.60 contribution attributed falsely to ‘PayPal.’”

Updated C-3 reports will be filed in periods that include these funds. These filings are summarized below.

- The \$2,276.60 deposits represent a transfer from PayPal, the primary method the PAC used to receive funds.
- The gross total of funds received into this aggregated transfer before fees were removed was \$2,404.
- \$2,001 of these funds were loans from Charles Wiegand, the Question PAC Treasurer.
- \$155 of these funds were donations under \$25. The funds were aggregated and deposited as a lump sum. Per RCW 42.17A.240(2)(c) a separate and private list of the name, address, and amount of each such contributor is maintained by the Treasurer.
- \$248.00 of the funds were reported as “anonymous contributions.” These funds were deposited into the operating account per the provisions of RCW 42.17A.220(4).

2) Failure to accurately describe expense, and the illegal concealment of required information from the public.

Complaint states “On January 8, 2021 – This PAC claims to have used vendor “SMG Spokane” and reportedly spent \$1,703.40 – on “Advertising” but no clarification or specifics.”

Updated C-3 reports will be filed in periods that include these funds with additional information on this transaction.

To summarize, the vendor used was Stephens Media Group, who aired commercials in the City of Spokane on the radio stations KEYF-FM and KZBD-FM in the month of October of 2019.

There was no attempt to conceal the required information from the public concerning this vendor or expenditure. The PAC was clearly identified in the radio communications, and it was the intent of the PAC to properly file the associated C-3 reports properly. Question PAC is taking every step possible to be in compliance with state regulations in both past and future filings.

Complaint states in various paragraphs that information regarding the payments to the vendors Google, Twitter, and FaceBook was illegally concealed.

All expenses paid to the vendors listed above between September 10th, 2018 and October 1st, 2020 were independent expenditures related to federal elective office. Expenditures such as these are specifically listed as an exception to the requirements of Chapter RCW 42.17A. We

will be noting when exempt political spending takes place with the specific notation of "Advertising Related to Federal Offices" or a similar phrase to reduce confusion in the future.

3) Failure to properly identify as a sponsored committee

With the updated C-3 filings, all the funds received and the sources of those funds—whether they be loans or donations from the public—have been disclosed. Starting a PAC from scratch involves a steep learning curve for various complex processes. The startup nature of this venture and its initial funding does not represent any attempt at concealing those funds.

Conclusion

Question PAC is a small, locally operated PAC founded by Charles Wiegand, a local businessman. He is eager to make an impact on the political landscape of his hometown and to maintain compliance with state election law.

The issues raised in this complaint could be addressed almost in their entirety with satisfactory reporting, which this PAC is working hard to implement.

We thank everyone involved with their attention to this matter.

This is to notify you that the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) intends to open a formal investigation on November 15, 2023, and, on that date, PDC staff will conduct an Initial Hearing (Case Status Review) concerning the complaints filed by Glen Morgan on August 16 & 19, 2023.

The complaints alleged that Question PAC may have violated RCW 42.17A.235 & .240 by failing to timely and accurately disclose contribution and expenditures, WAC 390-16-011A for failing to include the PAC sponsor name, RCW 42.17A.260 by failing to time and accurately file C-6 reports, and RCW 42.17A.265 by failing to timely disclose Last Minute Contributions.

The Initial Hearing (Case Status Review) is not an adjudicative proceeding. It is conducted in accordance with WAC 390-37-071 and is intended to provide you with information concerning the investigative process, including possible alternatives to resolve the matter. You are not required to participate in the hearing. Further, your failure to participate will not prejudice your rights concerning the investigative process, or any potential future adjudicative proceeding in the matter.

On the above date, the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) will hold a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) in accordance with RCW 42.17A.110 and RCW 42.17A.755, concerning the allegation that you violated RCW 42.17A.205, .235 and .240, by failing to timely and accurately disclose contribution and expenditures, WAC 390-16-011A for failing to include the PAC sponsor name, RCW 42.17A.260 by failing to time and accurately file C-6 reports, and RCW 42.17A.265 by failing to timely disclose Last Minute Contributions.

Under the Brief Enforcement Hearing rules, the Presiding Officer has the authority to assess a civil penalty in accordance with WAC 390-37-143, a penalty schedule adopted by the Commission (see enclosed copy).

You are not required by law to personally attend. However, the PDC recommends that respondents personally appear whenever possible.

Respondent and Complainant Notice Rights:

In accordance with WAC 390-37-060(5), the respondent and complainant are being provided notice 10 days in advance of the hearing. In accordance with WAC 390-37-030, the complainant does not have special standing to intervene in the hearing but may be called as a witness at the discretion of PDC staff. The Presiding Officer has the discretion to allow comment by a person other than the respondent during their consideration of the complaint. Any person who wishes to comment should notify staff at least three business days before the proceeding.

WAC 390-37-030 allows the complainant or any other person to submit documentary evidence and/or written factual or legal statements to the staff at any time up to and including the fifth calendar day before the date of any enforcement hearing or proceeding.

If there are materials you wish to have considered at the Brief Enforcement Hearing, you may attend the hearing in person, participate by telephone, remotely or submit written materials addressed to the Presiding Officer. Any written materials you choose to provide in advance of the Brief Enforcement Hearing should describe the facts of your case and any circumstances or mitigating factors you would like the Presiding Officer to consider. Please submit your written response so it is received by no later than **5 p.m. April 25, 2024**.

Please submit your written response so it is received by the PDC no later than **April 25, 2024**.

BRIEF ENFORCEMENT HEARINGS – INFORMATION FOR FILERS

You have received a letter or email from the PDC scheduling a Brief Enforcement Hearing before a PDC Commissioner. Here are the answers to some Frequently Asked Questions about these brief hearings. This FAQ is informational only and should not be considered legal advice.

What is a Brief Enforcement Hearing?

The PDC is responsible for enforcing the State's campaign finance laws. We may schedule what is called a Brief Enforcement Hearing (also known as a "Brief Adjudicative Proceeding" under the Administrative Procedure Act) to address compliance with campaign finance reporting requirements when evidence shows the following types of alleged violations may have occurred:

- Failure to file or timely file required reports of financial affairs, campaign contributions and/or expenditures, independent expenditures, or funds spent on lobbying;
- Improper use of public facilities or resources in election campaigns when the value of public funds expended or facilities used was minimal; and
- Infractions of political advertising laws regarding sponsor identification or political party identification.

Brief Enforcement Hearings may be scheduled on other matters as well, if the basic facts are agreed to or are not being contested, and it is anticipated that the likely penalty imposed (if a violation is found) will be \$1,000 or less. The Commission has adopted a penalty schedule for Brief Enforcement Hearings which can be found in the Washington Administrative Code [WAC 390-37-143](#).

A Presiding Officer, who is a PDC Commissioner, will conduct the hearing. PDC Staff will present the case to the Presiding Officer, and you will have an opportunity to explain the circumstances related to the alleged violations. You may do this in person, by telephone, or in writing by email or letter.

Who are the parties involved?

The PDC Staff initiates and investigates possible violations, and brings cases forward to the Commission or its Presiding Officer. The person who is alleged to be out of compliance with the law is referred to as the "Respondent."

What do I do to prepare for the hearing?

The brief hearings are informal in nature. You are not required to have an attorney for this hearing. Hearings take place in the PDC meeting room where Commission meetings are held. You need to let the staff know at least five business days before the hearing whether you will be participating in-person or by phone, or prefer not to participate.

If you are having other people (witnesses) testify on your behalf, they must be available at the hearing, and staff needs to be informed of the number of witnesses and time needed for their testimony when you notify the staff of your participation. The scheduled hearing starting time is the start time for several matters that will be heard by the Presiding Officer, and your case may not be the first one heard. So you will need to remain available to participate until your case is called.

Waiving your right to participate. If you have submitted nothing in writing prior to the hearing, have made no other arrangements, and you do not appear in person, by phone, or through your legal counsel at the hearing, it will be presumed that you have decided to waive your right to participate at the hearing.

What happens at the hearing?

The Presiding Officer will introduce the participants and explain the procedure for the hearing. The hearing will be audio-taped.

The Presiding Officer will swear-in PDC Staff for them to present information regarding the alleged violation of law. You will then have an opportunity to testify, which is your opportunity to present information. All testimony by staff, Respondents, and witnesses is given under oath, but at a regular meeting table or online, not in a courtroom. The Presiding Officer may ask you some questions about the information you, PDC Staff, or witnesses have presented. If you have decided to participate in writing instead of in person or by phone, your written information will be considered by the Presiding Officer as part of the hearing materials.

If at any time the Presiding Officer believes the alleged violations are serious enough to merit penalties greater than \$1,000, the Presiding Officer will adjourn the hearing and direct that the matter be scheduled for a hearing before the full Commission at a later time.

How is the decision made?

After considering all the information presented at the hearing, the Presiding Officer will make a decision about the allegation(s) and any appropriate penalty amount. The decision is typically announced orally at the hearing.

The Presiding Officer will use the penalty schedule referred to above that has been adopted by the Commission in rule to determine the appropriate penalty for certain types of violations, taking into account aggravating and mitigating factors. The penalty schedule is below.

What happens after my hearing?

A written decision, called an Initial Order, laying out the Presiding Officer's ruling, including the findings and the penalty, will be sent to you. The PDC tries to get orders issued within 10 days if possible, and not later than 30 days. If a monetary penalty is imposed in the Initial Order, the penalty must be paid to the **Washington State Treasurer**, and mailed to the address listed in the Order cover letter within the time frame stated in the Order.

Along with your Initial Order, you will also receive information about your appeal rights, including how to request review or reconsideration by the full Commission if you disagree with the Initial Order. Follow these procedures carefully if you wish to appeal. If there is no appeal before the PDC, the Initial Order becomes a Final Order, and further appeals must be made in Superior Court.

What are the rules that apply to the procedures of my hearing?

The PDC's laws and rules are available on the PDC's website at www.pdc.wa.gov. The laws are in the Revised Code of Washington ([RCW Chapter 42.17A](#)). The rules are in the Washington Administrative Code ([WAC Title 390](#)). Brief Adjudicative Proceedings are described at [WAC 390-37-140](#) through [390-37-150](#) and in the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) at [RCW 34.05.482-494](#).

Penalty Schedule [[WAC 390-37-143](#)]:

The Presiding Officer may assess a penalty up to one thousand dollars upon finding a violation of chapter [42.17A](#) RCW or Title 390 WAC.

"Occasion" means established violation. Only violations in the last five years will be considered for the purpose of determining second and third occasions.

(2) In determining the appropriate penalty, the presiding officer may consider the nature of the violation and aggravating and mitigating factors, including:

(a) Whether the respondent is a first-time filer;

(b) The respondent's compliance history for the last five years, including whether the noncompliance was isolated or limited in nature, indicative of systematic or ongoing problems, or part of a pattern of violations by the respondent, or in the case of a political committee or other entity, part of a pattern of violations by the respondent's officers, staff, principal decision makers, consultants, or sponsoring organization;

(c) The respondent's unpaid penalties from a previous enforcement action;

(d) The impact on the public, including whether the noncompliance deprived the public of timely or accurate information during a time-sensitive period, or otherwise had a significant or material impact on the public;

- (e) The amount of financial activity by the respondent during the statement period or election cycle;
 - (f) Whether the late or unreported activity was significant in amount or duration under the circumstances, including in proportion to the total amount of expenditures by the respondent in the campaign or statement period;
 - (g) Corrective action or other remedial measures initiated by respondent prior to enforcement action, or promptly taken when noncompliance brought to respondent's attention;
 - (h) Good faith efforts to comply, including consultation with PDC staff prior to initiation of enforcement action and cooperation with PDC staff during enforcement action, and a demonstrated wish to acknowledge and take responsibility for the violation;
 - (i) Personal emergency or illness of the respondent or member of his or her immediate family;
 - (j) Other emergencies such as fire, flood, or utility failure preventing filing;
 - (k) Sophistication of respondent or the financing, staffing, or size of the respondent's campaign or organization; and
 - (l) PDC staff, third-party vendor, or equipment error, including technical problems at the agency preventing or delaying electronic filing.
- (3) The presiding officer has authority to suspend all or a portion of an assessed penalty under the conditions to be determined by that officer including, but not limited to, payment of the nonsuspended portion of the penalty within five business days of the date of the entry of the order in that case.
- (4) If, on the third occasion, a respondent has outstanding penalties or judgments, the matter will be directed to the full commission for consideration.
- (5) The presiding officer may direct a matter to the full commission if the officer believes one thousand dollars would be an insufficient penalty or the matter warrants consideration by the full commission. Cases will automatically be scheduled before the full commission for an enforcement action when the respondent:
- (a) Was found in violation during a previous reporting period;
 - (b) The violation remains in effect following any appeals; and
 - (c) The person has not filed the disclosure forms that were the subject of the prior violation at the time the current hearing notice is being sent.
