The hearing was 18 held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 19 Commissioners present online were Nancy Isserlis, Commission Chair (presiding); Allen 20 Hayward, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners Fred Jarrett, and J. Robert Leach. Also 21 present both online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the 22 Commission, and Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Coordinator. The proceeding was open 23 to the public and recorded. 24 The Commissioners had before them the following materials: 25

 Case memorandum dated November 8, 2023, prepared by Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Coordinator;

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent Christopher Moore, a City Council Member for the City of Orting since 2021. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 17, 2023, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2022. The Respondent has one prior violation within the last five years.

- From March 9, 2023, through April 13, 2023, PDC staff emailed reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2022.
- 2. On October 30, 2023, and November 2, 2023, PDC staff mailed and emailed the Respondent a hearing notice to his email and physical address of record for a November 16, 2023, Enforcement Hearing along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely, before the full Public Disclosure Commission concerning his failure to file the F-1 report.
- 3. As of the date of the hearing, the Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report covering calendar year 2022 that was due no later than April 17, 2023.
- 4. There is one prior case for violation of RCW 42.17A.700:

• PDC Case 110455. At a September 1, 2022, Brief Enforcement Hearing, the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2021, which was due not later than April 15, 2022. A total civil penalty of \$250 was assessed, with \$125 suspended, in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that time. The Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report and has not paid the civil penalties.

## II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
   42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
   RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
- 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office in 2022 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2022 no later than April 17, 2023.

## III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission assesses a civil penalty of \$1,000 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2022, with \$500 suspended, on the following conditions:

- a. The \$500 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2022 in violation of RCW
   42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order or through an approved payment plan.
  - b. The past due civil penalties for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2021, in violation of RCW 42.17A.700, totaling \$250 plus collection fees are paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order or through an approved payment plan.
  - c. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2021, and 2022, are filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
  - d. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
- 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar year 2022 shall immediately become due without further action by the Commission and all past due penalties may be sent to collections or to Superior Court for enforcement.
