Re: Campaign Violation

On Friday October 20, 2017 the enclosed campaign flyer was distributed through the Buckley Post Office. The information contained was gleaned from budget documents made available to the public using GAAP. During the Mayor's run in office the Natural gas system has been sold, the Jail closed & Dispatch taken over by Pierce County on a county wide vote, so none of those operations were included in any results. Public Works 2017 had Administrative fees included without which the amount would be \$1,170,706 & % increase would be 193%. This is an issue I've had with the city for several years. I disagree with the State Auditor's conclusion (verbally told to the council by the CA) that the city has provided a solution to the issue.

That afternoon, October 20, I noticed the City Administrator's truck parked by Buckley City Hall though city offices are closed to all public business on Fridays.

The following Tuesday October 24, 2017 the enclosed memo was distributed to the Mayor & City Council at their regularly scheduled meeting. In the 1st paragraph of that memo the city administrator states that what I said at the Transportation & Utilities council committee budget meeting of 17 October 2017 was totally incorrect. For the record the committee meeting is an open meeting, but only rarely does someone show up just to listen. It is unrecorded so I make it a point to make thorough notes when I am making a serious point. At the meeting I provided a comparison of the of the 2006 & 2018 budget which was the meeting's topic. Also presented at the committee meeting was the fact that the city's population was at about the same level in both years, the extensive use of consultants @ high per hour cost, the amount taxes controlled by statute had risen, the amount SS had risen during that time & the fact that the contracted Garbage utility had risen much less than that though subject to tipping fees much larger than their internal growth. I then pointed out that utility money because of city utility taxes & state excise taxes was the most expensive money going into the general fund to the individual taxpayer. I then presented a calculation showing what the savings would be to individual families were the enterprises Owned/Operated by the city more inline with general wage increases. & at the end I did a comparison of the rise in administrative costs between 2017 & 2018. I have the only copy of what was said. Other than a comment by the Committee chair of "What's the point" & my answer of "there is too much money being spent for little return" there was no further discussion.

I have been told that the Mayor was doorbelling with that information in the 10-24 memo prior to it being made available to the public or the city council at the October 24 council meeting & using the term totally incorrect.

The following day, Wednesday October 25, 2017 I placed a RFI in to Buckley city hall for the information noted on the enclosed RFI. I received that information on Monday October 30, 2017 without the requested markup of budget categories to show where he gathered his information. It was slightly different, with no designation of budget categories as requested, than the one I have as the CA was famous for new figures each month during the process. Included with that info was a note from???? showing allowable actions under the Public Disclosure Act. That will also be included.

Since my visit to PDC offices in Olympia there has been additional action. The vote has been extremely close with lead changes & never out of single digits. On 11-13-2017 I placed additional RFI's asking for the info I

had originally requested in the initial RFI. I received a letter stating they are not required to comply with my request but during the discussion about what I wanted I was given a spreadsheet that I am not sure what it is trying to convey. Interesting that the city provided me a spreadsheet that took a lot of time to prepare but will not take the limited time required to actually show where the City Administrator derived the numbers used to make his claim of totally incorrect. If the spreadsheet was done to enforce the City Administrators position it was done on city time, if it was done to show what has happened since he became City administrator his term began in late 2001, if it was done to show changes in city operations the city has eliminated budget categories aforementioned while adding an IT function which includes 1 FTE position. Otherwise it is not something that has ever been available to anyone. I believe this is something created on city time to cover his actions?

On Friday 11-17-2017 I went to Pierce County election to get an update on the election & inquire to the 18 votes that so far are not shown in the totals. They provided a printout showing 9 votes that were unsigned & 9 that had questionable signatures. I plan to go back when the election is certified & get another printout showing who complied with the request for verification. Note that 14 of those votes arrived on 11-8 or 11-9. Note that 10 of those ballots have PO Boxes. There were ballots laying all over the Post Office initially. It never crossed my mind that someone might fill out one of those ballots & submit it, until now.

Minutes of the 10-24-2017 council meeting received & approved by the council on 11-14-2017 still contain the inflammatory rhetoric contained in original memo.

I believe the actions of the City Administrator fall outside those allowable under the Act:

- 1) use of Public facilities & time to research & create the response shown in the memo at a time not available to the public. That information being provided to the Incumbent prior to being made available to the public & utilized by the incumbent prior to that time.
- 2) The numbers provided by the CA in the memo are significantly inaccurate in 5 of 10 instances. This along with the verbiage attempting to obfuscate the issue & make the incumbents spending record look acceptable. The years in play are 2006 & 2017, the generosity the CA describes is not a posted city policy.
- 3) The memo was received by the City Council on a night the City Administrator received an extension on his contract though there is a contested election for the position of Mayor in this 11-7-2017 general election which institutes the right of whoever is elected to designate their staff. Was he trying to make sure he received that extension with the creation of the memo?

As a citizen I have no recourse other than your office or the press to these actions. The Mayor was desperate to hang on to her position & apparently willing to break the law to do so. The City Administrator was willing to be a participant in those actions by providing cover for her statements for a financial award. The election has been so close that influencing a couple of families would change the result. I believe the above noted actions to be in violation of 42.17A.335 (1a) & (2), meeting the intent of (2) in Intent & Findings. I believe the above stated actions affected the outcome of the election & seek redress per RCW. 42.17A..750 (1)(a) & whatever violation the commission finds covered by 42.17A.750 (2).

I will provide copies of most referenced materials at this time with the understanding that copies of the budget are available or anything else you may desire to see & I am willing to bring them to your office to explain them as some abbreviations are confusing plus they are bulky for the info they generate.

I certify under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington that the information provided with the complaint is true & correct to the best of my knowledge & belief.

On Tuesday night October 17, 2017, during a City Transportation/Utilities budget meeting Councilmember Sundstrom made public statements about utility expenditures that were totally incorrect. It is my understanding that he is now communicating similar statements to the community at large so I wanted to take this opportunity to state the facts for the record.

Mr. Sundstrom recently sent a flyer out the community with the following table:

Attached is a detailed table illustrating all of the costs from City operations from the period of 2006-2017 taken directly from the approved/adopted budget documents.

Budget documents during this period provide thorough explanations for the organizational structure of the department and discuss the changes that were proposed for the budget year under consideration. As the table illustrates Public Works is operating with the same number of FTE's in 2017 as they had in 2007, with the exception of part-time seasonal employees that are used for summer maintenance. The increase in 2007 was the result of a collaborative decision on the part of the City to increase staffing levels due to significant regulatory and infrastructure changes. These were primarily related to WUTC inspections of the gas system and compliance with Federal Pipeline Safety requirements, and increased regulatory requirements under the new Phase II Stormwater NPDES Permit based on compliance with the Clean Water Act.

Many variables contribute to year over year changes in salaries & benefits other than the reduction or addition of employees such as apprentice positions completing training and being promoted to journey level status that come with a higher wage; union contract negotiations that provide for cost of living increases; graduated step increases for less senior employees; any restructuring of positions like the creation or elimination of leads and/or supervisors; increase in State LEOFF or PERS retirement contribution levels; changes in FICA, L&I or Employment Security payments to Federal or State government; and increase to healthcare premiums which have experienced double digit annual increases over the period.

City Councils of the past and present have consistently communicated their commitment to paying a fair and equitable wage comparative with other public agencies for the position and duties assigned, and to reflect increases in cost of living. As the table illustrates the cumulative CPI has increased by 28.0% during this period, and review of all labor contracts for PW employee's shows that they have received increases of 32.75% during the same period. The largest percentage gains for the bargaining unit were in 2009-2010 when inflation was below 1%. This is not abnormal and clearly shows that the City has maintained their commitment but nothing more.

MAIN AGENDA

<u>Presentation: Paul Adams – Mt. Peak Historical Fire Lookout Association:</u> Paul Adams – 288 Michael Ave. Enumclaw, WA 98022

Paul Adams gave a presentation to the Council regarding the Mt. Peak Historical Lookout that he and other members of the Association developed and have been working on. He discussed where the Association is in the process, had displays of what they expect the lookout will look like, and he touched on how they are going to use different materials to minimize vandalism.
