To whom it may concern,

It has recently come to my attention that the Woodland Citizens for Schools PAC has committed a variety of violations of Washington State's campaign finance laws (RCW 42.17A) during their recent 2024 special election levy campaign earlier this month. The violations are as follows:

1) Failure to report source of secret contributions (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, .235)

This is a continuing PAC that began the recent political campaign with \$1,800.13 (See attached final 2020 C4, line 18, PDC Tracking # 100974214, attached for staff reference). However, with the extremely late first C4 report filed for the 2024 Levy campaign by this same PAC, they start out with a balance of \$1,853.00, and this appears to include a secret contribution of \$52.87. Where did this secret contribution come from? Clearly they need to report the true source of these secret, mystery funds.

2) Failure to timely file contribution and expenditure reports (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, .235)

Every report filed by this well-funded PAC appears to be filed late. Months of expenditures and contributions were concealed from the public until just a few days before the election. In fact, it appears this secretive PAC had planned to keep all this information concealed from the public until a local resident attempted to inspect this campaign books (an effort, that I am told was refused by this PAC, which is a separate violation – I've encouraged the local citizen to file their own complaint on that one).

Regardless of what triggered the egregiously illegally late reporting, this is a clear violation of the law. In addition, the 21-day and 7-day report were also not timely filed. This is an experienced PAC with strong support for deep-pocket donors like the Washington Education Association PAC. They clearly have the resources to comply with the law. They just willfully failed to do so.

3) Failure to provide legally required details on most expenditures (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, . 235, WAC 390-16-037, example B)

In every instance where this well-funded PAC made expenditures which included signs, mailers, and brochures, they failed to provide the legally required details as clearly explained in WAC 390-16-037, example B. All these reports will need to be correct. Lest there be any confusion, the following reports are lacking the legally required details:

Report # 110200653 (signs, door hangers, plus the WEA printed materials) – attached for staff reference

Report # 100963298 (signs – not clear what the "decals" really refers to) – 2020 campaign – attached

3) Apparent attempt to conceal expenditures or a failure to report expenditures (Violation of RCW 42.17A.240, .235)

There was also at least one electronic billboard this campaign was funding (or it was an inkind contribution to the campaign. I've attached a few photos of this which were taken during the campaign. It was clearly indicating to vote Yes, so it should have been reported as a campaign expenditure.

There may have been additional expenditures unreported. I've included some random photos from the recent campaign, and the campaign can clarify which ones were reported on which line item and which one were not.

Clearly, with \$18,000 expenditures concealed from the public for the majority of this multimonth campaign, and with substantial support from the Washington Education Association PAC (itself a prolific violator of Washington State's campaign finance laws – See PDC enforcement case #144263 (settlement attached for reference), PDC Enforcement Case #141529 – still an open and ongoing investigation, and additional PDC Enforcement Settlement attached), this PAC has plenty of financial support and expertise to follow the law. While it could be that the WEA spends it's resources helping people break the law, judging from their past behavior, this is still no excuse for this local PAC to break the law on their own.





I, Aimee Iverson, Secretary/Treasurer for Washington Education Association Political Action Committee (WEA-PAC), hereby acknowledge that during 2023, WEA-PAC violated RCW 42.17A.235 and RCW 42.17A.240 by failing to report an outstanding debt of more than \$1,000 for legal services incurred on its Campaign Summary Receipts & Expenditures report (PDC Form C-4) covering the period 9/1/2023 – 10/16/2023.

The facts are as follows:

- The campaign's C-4 report covering the period 9/1/2023 10/16/2023 (the 21-day pre-general election C-4 Report), timely filed on 10/17/2023, included no amount for debts and obligations.
- The C-4 report was required to include an outstanding debt in the amount of \$5,583.80 owed to the law firm of Barnard Iglitzin & Lavitt for legal services provided to the PAC in August and September 2023 to address prior complaints filed with the Public Disclosure Commission.
- O In accordance with WAC 390-16-042 the portion of the outstanding debt related to August legal services was not required to be reported on the August 2023 C-4 report but was required to be reported on the 21-day pre-general election C-4 report along with the September legal services.
- The 21-day pre-general election C-4 report deprived the public of information concerning the PAC's debts and obligations.

I would like to avoid the time and expense resulting from a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding. Therefore, in lieu of PDC staff scheduling a hearing, I am entering into this *Statement of Understanding* (SOU) to resolve this matter.

GLEN MORGAN ("STATE"), and Defendants, WASHINGTON EDUCATION ASSOCIATION POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE ("COMMITTEE"), a Washington Registered Political Committee, which acts as the political wing of the Defendant, WASHINGTON EDUCATION ASSOCIATION ("ASSOCIATION"); desiring to resolve all claims arising out of the State's complaint, hereby enter the following stipulation:

1. For the purposes of Settlement, the Parties have agreed that the Defendants will not admit to violations of Ch. 42.17A RCW during calendar years 2016, 2017 and 2018.

- 2. For the purposes of this Stipulation and Judgement, the Parties agree that there are no outstanding C-3 Reports and C-4 Reports outstanding at the time of the entry of this Stipulation and Judgment.
- 3. The Defendants, through their executive director agrees to watch completely the videos "DC Campaign Finance Rules for Candidates and Political Committees, and "PDC How to use ORCA for Campaign Finance Reporting" (both available on the Public Disclosure Commission ("PDC") Website); or alternatively attend a one-day training seminar put by the PDC for campaign finance rules and reporting within 90 days of the entry of the Judgement. Defendants executive director will provide signed affidavits to either watching of the identified videos or attendance at the identified training seminar within 90 days of the entry of the Judgement.
- 4. Defendants, jointly and severally, agree to pay an assessed civil penalty to the state in the amount of \$16,438.00.
- 5. The Parties agree that \$14,749.20 of the assessed civil penalty (90%) will be suspended on the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The suspension will be in effect for four (3) years from the date of entry of the Judgement. During the period of suspension, Defendants each agree that they will not violate any provision of Ch. 42.17A RCW.
 - b. In the event that any of the Defendants, are found by the PDC or a court to have committed more than a *de minimis* violation of Ch. 24.17A RCW during the suspension period, the suspended penalty of \$14,749.20 will become

immediately due and payable to the State within 30 days of such finding without further intervention of the Court.

- c. In the event that the Defendants are <u>not</u> found by the PDC or a court to have committed violation of Ch. 24.17A RCW for conduct occurring during the suspension period, then the suspended portion of the penalty will be set aside.
- d. If the Defendants fail to pay any portion of the unsuspended civil penalty, attorney fees, or costs, the suspended civil penalty of \$14,749.20 will become immediately due and payable within 30 days of such finding without further intervention of the Court.
- e. If the Defendants fail to comply with their obligations under Section (2) and (3) of the above Stipulation, the suspended civil penalty of \$14,749.20 will become immediately due and payable within 30 days of such finding without further intervention of the Court.
- 6. Defendants agree to pay the State the unsuspended portion of the civil penalty \$1,643.80 within 30 days from the date of entry of this Stipulation and Judgment.
- 7. Defendants agree to pay by separate transmittal, \$2,916.08 in attorney fees and costs in this legal action, to Plaintiff's counsel, Possinger Law Group, PLLC, within 30 days of the entry of this Stipulation and Judgment.

- The Defendants will file all outstanding C-3 Reports and C-4 Reports, if any, within
 days of the entry of this Stipulation and Judgment.
- 2. The Defendant, Washington Education Association, through their executive director, Armand Tiberio (also the Treasurer of Washington Education Association Political Action Committee), shall watch completely the videos "DC Campaign Finance Rules for Candidates and Political Committees, and "PDC How to use ORCA for Campaign Finance Reporting" (both available on the Public Disclosure Commission ("PDC") Website); or alternatively attend a one-day training seminar put by the PDC for campaign finance rules and reporting within 90 days of the entry of the Judgement. Defendants executive director/treasurer will provide a signed certification to either watching of the identified videos or attendance at the identified training seminar within 90 days of the entry of the Judgement. Such certification shall be provided to plaintiff's counsel by regular first class mail and/or electronic mail within the specified time frames.

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- 3. Defendants, are hereby, jointly and severally, assessed a civil penalty, in the amount of \$16,438.00 payable to the State of Washington.
- 4. Of the assessed civil penalty, set out above, \$14,749.20 of this amount is hereby suspended upon Defendants compliance with the following court-ordered conditions:
 - a. The suspension will be in effect for four (3) years from the date of entry of the Judgement. During the period of suspension,
 Defendants each agree that they will not violate any provision of Ch.
 42.17A RCW.
 - b. In the event that any of the Defendants, are found by the PDC or a court to have committed more than a *de minimis* violation of Ch.
 42.17A RCW during the suspension period, the suspended penalty of \$14,749.20 will become immediately due and payable to the State within 30 days of such finding without further intervention of the Court.
 - c. In the event that the Defendants are <u>not</u> found by the PDC or a court to have committed violation of Ch. 24.17A RCW for conduct occurring during the suspension period, then the suspended portion of the penalty will be set aside.
 - d. If the Defendants fail to pay any portion of the suspended civil penalty, attorney fees, or costs, the suspended civil penalty of

\$14,749.20 will become immediately due and payable within 30 days of such finding without further intervention of the Court.

- e. If the Defendants fail to comply with their obligations under Section
 (2) and (3) of the above Stipulation, the suspended civil penalty of
 \$14,749.20 will become immediately due and payable within 30 days
 of such finding without further intervention of the Court.
- 5. Defendants agree to pay the State the unsuspended portion of the civil penalty \$1,643.80 within 30 days from the date of entry of this Judgment.
- 6. No prejudgment interest is owed on this Judgement. Principal Judgment amounts due and owing shall not bear interest unless the Principal Judgment is unpaid by the Defendants by the due dates specified in this Judgment. In the event that payments are not made by the due date specified; the Principal Judgment shall bear interest at a rate of 12 percent per annum.
- 7. Defendants agree to pay Plaintiff's counsel, Possinger Law Group, PLLC, \$2,916.08 in attorney fees costs within 30 days of the entry of this Judgment.
