Authority:	RCW 42.17A and WAC 390.

In accordance with RCW 42.17A.110 and RCW 42.17A.755, the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) will hold a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (BAP, Brief Enforcement Hearing) concerning the allegation that you, as a 2023 candidate seeking re-election to the office of School Director, Position #4 for the Mead School District, violated RCW 42.17.235 by failing to timely file the 7-Day Pre- General Election Summary Full Campaign Contribution and Expenditure Report (C-4 Report), as required for a 2023 candidate appearing on the November 7, 2023 general election ballot.

As noted in the PDC staff email exchanges with you in March of 2024, staff offered you the opportunity to resolve this matter by accepting a proposed Statement of Understanding (SOU) and paying a \$150 civil penalty. You declined that offer and requested this matter be heard at a BAP hearing, so this matter has now been officially scheduled.

I am enclosing an electronic copy of the BAP Hearing Memorandum from PDC staff. The BAP Hearing has been scheduled to determine if the violation occurred, and, if necessary, assess a penalty.

If you do not plan to be present at the hearing, you may submit evidence in your own behalf or in mitigation no later than 1:00 p.m. on April 29, 2024, for review by the Presiding Officer. You may do so by writing to the Chair, Public Disclosure Commission, and emailing that information on the PDC Case ticket.

The PDC recommends that all respondents personally appear whenever possible, either remotely through Teams or in-person. PDC staff will present this matter to the Presiding Officer and staff will email you the Teams information to call in or a link to participate remotely through the Case ticket.

Under the BAP Enforcement Hearing rules, the Presiding Officer has the authority to assess a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 for multiple violations in accordance with WAC 390-37-143, the BAP penalty schedule adopted by the Commission. I provided you with a link to the PDC Enforcement Guide as part of the March 6, 2024 email I sent to you.

Respondent and Complainant Notice Rights:

In accordance with WAC 390-37-060(5), the respondent and complainant are being provided notice in advance of the enforcement hearing. In accordance with WAC 390-37-030, the complainant does not have special standing to intervene in the hearing. The presiding officer has the discretion to allow comment by a person other than the respondent during their consideration of the complaint. Any person who wishes to comment should notify staff at least three business days before the proceeding.

WAC 390-37-030 also allows the complainant or any other person to submit documentary evidence and/or written factual or legal statements to the staff at any time up to and including the fifth calendar day before the date of any enforcement hearing or proceeding.
