At the August 22, 2024 Enforcement hearing, the Commission assessed a total civil penalty of \$2000, of which \$500 is suspended, in accordance with WAC 390-37-182. The \$1500 non-suspended penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order, which is **October 21, 2024**.

Respondent Dustin Kraft was provided notice on August 12, 2024, of the hearing date 17 and did not appear on his own behalf. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 18 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 19 Commissioners present in-person were Allen Hayward, Commission Chair (presiding); 20 J. Robert Leach, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners Nancy Isserlis, Douglass North, 21 and James Oswald. Also present both in-person and online were Assistant Attorney General 22 Matthew Kernutt representing the Commission, and Senior Assistant Attorney General Chad 23 Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance Coordinator. The 24 proceeding was open to the public and recorded. 25

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated August 14, 2024, prepared by Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Enforcement Hearing Notice, PDC Case No. 158061, mailed, emailed, and dated August 12, 2024;
- 3. PDC Initial order, Case 110467, dated September 29, 2022;
- 4. PDC Final order, Case 140324, dated September 7, 2023.

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent Dustin Kraft, a current Fire Commissioner for Clallam County Fire Protection District 01. He was most recently elected to that position in 2023. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2024, disclosing financial information for the calendar year 2023. The Respondent has two prior violations within the last five years.

- Between March 12<sup>th</sup> and April 23, 2024, PDC staff emailed seven reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2023.
- On August 12, 2024, PDC Staff served the Respondent by email and mail, with a
  hearing notice for an August 22, 2024, Enforcement Hearing before the full
  Public Disclosure Commission concerning his failure to file the F-1 report for
  calendar year 2023.

3. As of the date of the hearing the Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report covering calendar year 2023 that was due no later than April 15, 2024.

- 4. There are two prior cases for violation of RCW 42.17A.700:
  - PDC Case 110467. At a September 1, 2022, Brief Enforcement Hearing, Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2021, which was due not later than April 15, 2022. A civil penalty of \$500 was assessed, with \$250 suspended, in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that time. The Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report or paid the civil penalty and it has been sent to collection.
  - PDC Case 140324. At an August 24, 2023, Enforcement Hearing before the full Commission, the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2022, which was due not later than April 17, 2023. A total civil penalty of \$2,000, with \$1,000 suspended, was assessed in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that time. The Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report and has not paid the civil penalty and it has been sent to collection.

2	II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
3	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
4	42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
5	RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
6	
7	2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office
8	in 2023 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for
9	calendar year 2023 no later than April 15, 2024.
10	
11	
12	III. ORDER
13	This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and
14	aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission
15	assesses a civil penalty of \$2,000 for the late filed F-1 report with \$500 suspended on the
16	following conditions:
17	
18	1. a. The \$1,500 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to
19	timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2023 in violation of RCW
20	42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final
21	Order.
22	
23	b. The past due civil penalties for failure to timely file the F-1 reports for
24	calendar years 2021 and 2022, in violation of RCW 42.17A.700, totaling
25	\$2,500, plus any collection fees, is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the

date of this Final Order.

2	c. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2021, 2022, and 2023, are
3	filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
4	
5	d. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting
6	requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of
7	Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this
8	Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any
9	remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as
10	appropriate to address by a technical correction.
11	
12	2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1)(a-c) of this order
13	within 30 days of the date of this order, or does not remain in full compliance
14	with Section III(1)(d), the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar year 2023
15	shall immediately become due without further action by the Commission and all
16	past due penalties may be sent to collection or to Superior Court for enforcement.
