At the September 26, 2024 Enforcement hearing, the Commission assessed a total civil penalty of \$2000, of which \$1000 is suspended, in accordance with WAC 390-37-182. The \$1000 non-suspended penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order, which is **November 6, 2024**.

Robert Leach, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners Nancy Isserlis, Douglass North, 21 and James Oswald. Also present were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing 22 the Commission, Senior Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and 23 Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance Coordinator. Notice was provided to the Respondent and 24 she did not appear on her own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded. 25

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated September 18, 2024, prepared by Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Hearing Notice, mailed and dated September 12, 2024;
- 3. Final Orders for prior violations: PDC Case 94003, served March 4, 2022, and Case 109816, served September 23, 2022.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent Jean Dillenburg, an elected Hospital Commissioner for Grant County Hospital District 4. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2024, disclosing financial information for the calendar year 2023.

- Between March 12th and April 23rd of 2024, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2023.
- 2. On September 12, 2024, PDC Staff served the Respondent by email and mail with a hearing notice for a September 26, 2024, Enforcement Hearing before the full Public Disclosure Commission concerning her failure to file the F-1 report.
- 4. As of the date of the hearing the Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report covering calendar year 2023 that was due no later than April 15, 2024.

5. There are two prior cases for violation of RCW 42.17A.700:

- PDC Case 94003. At a July 15, 2021, Brief Enforcement Hearing, Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2020, which was due not later than April 15, 2021. A total civil penalty of \$250 was assessed in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that time. As of September 26, 2024, the Respondent has not filed the required F-1 report but has paid the civil penalty.
- PDC Case 109816. At an August 25, 2022, Brief Enforcement Hearing, Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2021, which was due not later than April 15, 2022. A total civil penalty of \$500 was assessed in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that time. As of September 26, 2024, the Respondent has not filed the required F-1 report or paid the civil penalty.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
 42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office in 2023 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2023 no later than April 15, 2024.

III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission assesses a civil penalty of \$2,000 for the late filed F-1 Report, with \$1,000 suspended, on the following conditions:

- a. The \$1,000 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2023 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - b. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2020, 2021, and 2023, are filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - c. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a

3	2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within				
4	30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar				
5	year 2023 shall immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection				
6	or brought to Superior Court as allowed by law without further action by the				
7	Commission.
