- 3. Final Order for prior violation: PDC Case 141896, served November 9, 2023.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent Nicholas Henderson, a County Coroner in Kittitas County. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2024, disclosing financial information for the calendar year 2023.

- Between March 12th and April 23rd of 2024, PDC staff sent seven email reminders
 to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for
 calendar year 2023.
- 2. On October 3, 2024, PDC Staff served the Respondent by email and mail with a hearing notice for an October 24, 2024, Enforcement Hearing before the full Public Disclosure Commission concerning his failure to file the F-1 report. The notice was sent to the Respondent's email and mailing address of record.
- 3. As of the date of the hearing the Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report covering calendar year 2023 that was due no later than April 15, 2024.

14		II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
15	1.	The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
16		42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
17		RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

19	2.	Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office
20		in 2023 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for
21		calendar year 2023 no later than April 15, 2024.

III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission assesses a civil penalty of \$1,000 for the late filed F-1 Report, with \$500 suspended, on the following conditions:

- 1. a. The \$500 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2023 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - b. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2022 and 2023, are filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - c. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
- 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar year 2023 shall immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection
