Authority: RCW 42.17A and WAC 390

In accordance with RCW 42.17A.110 and RCW 42.17A.755, the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) will conduct a hearing concerning staff's allegations that SEIU Healthcare 1199 NW PAC (the Committee), during the 2024 general, violated (1) RCW 42.17A.235 and 42.17A.240 by failing to timely report expenditures and (2) RCW 42.17.265 by failing to file the special report due when making a contribution of \$1,500 or more during the 21 days prior to an election.

The Commission may consider accepting a Stipulation if presented by the parties. *See* <u>WAC</u> <u>390-37-090</u>. The Commission has the authority to assess a penalty of up to \$10,000 per violation in accordance with <u>WAC 390-37-182</u>.

You may submit written material no later than 4 p.m. on May 19, 2025 for review by Commission members. You may do so by writing to the Chair, Public Disclosure Commission, P.O. Box 40908, Olympia, WA 98504-0908, or by email at pdc.wa.gov. If you submit such evidence by postal mail, please also submit it by email.

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The Public Disclosure Commission recommends that respondents personally appear whenever possible. PDC staff will be represented by an Assistant Attorney General for the presentation of this matter to the Commission.

Complainant Notice Rights:

In accordance with <u>WAC 390-37-060(5)</u>, the complainant is being provided notice in advance of the enforcement hearing. In accordance with <u>WAC 390-37-030</u>, the complainant does not have special standing to intervene in the hearing. The presiding officer has the discretion to allow comments by a person other than the respondent during their consideration of the complaint. Any person who wishes to comment should notify staff at least three business days before the proceeding.

<u>WAC 390-37-030</u> also allows the complainant or any other person to submit documentary evidence and/or written factual or legal statements to the staff at any time up to and including the fifth calendar day before the date of any enforcement hearing or proceeding. Such information should be sent electronically to <u>pdc@pdc.wa.gov</u>.
