Enclosed is a copy of the Public Disclosure Commission's Final Order Imposing Fine entered in the above-referenced case. At its September 25, 2025, meeting, the Commission found you in violation of RCW 42.17A.640(2)(a)(i)(A), and WAC 390-20-125, and assessed a total civil penalty of \$5,000 with \$2,500 suspended on the conditions set forth in the Final Order.

16	I. INTRODUCTION				
17	This matter was heard in-person and by audio	and online streaming by the Washington			
18	State Public Disclosure Commission (PDC, Commissi	ion) on September 25, 2025. The hearing			
19	was held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42	.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.			
20	Commissioners present in-person were J. Robe	ert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding);			
21	Douglass North, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commi	ssioner James Oswald. Also present were			
22	Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader represent	ting the Commission; Assistant Attorney			
23	General Susie Giles-Klein representing PDC staff; and	d Alice Fiman, Compliance Manager, and			
24	Kim Bradford, Deputy Director, for PDC Staff. Tobac	cco-Free Action Fund was represented by

2	The hearing concerned allegations that the Respondent violated RCW					
3	42.17A.640(2)(a)(i)(A) and WAC 390-20-125 for failing to: a) register and report a grassroots					
4	lobbying campaign within 24 hours of the initial presentation to the public when the campaign					
5	occurred during the period beginning 30 days before the regular legislative session through the					
6	end of that session; and b) timely report the date the campaign was first presented to the public.

II. STIPULATION

The parties jointly submitted a signed Stipulation as to Facts, Violations, and Penalties (Stipulation). Ms. Giles-Klein presented the Stipulation, reviewed the aggravating and mitigating factors, summarized the penalties recommended by PDC Staff, and asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation. Ms. Fiman and Ms. Bradford provided testimony and clarification for PDC staff. Mr. Estep and Mr. Bennett provided testimony for the Respondent, were available for questions, and confirmed the information provided by the PDC. The Respondent took responsibility and asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation. The Commission voted 3-0 to accept the Stipulation as submitted.

III. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Respondent, Tobacco-Free Action Fund has been listed as lobbying client with the PDC since 2019. In the 2025 legislative session, the Respondent sponsored a grassroots lobbying campaign in support of Senate Bill 5183/House Bill 1203 that advocated for the prohibition of the sale of certain tobacco and nicotine products in Washington. The Respondent failed to timely report \$285,585.90 in expenditures by the campaign. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.

2. The Respondent filed its January, 2025, L-6 monthly report 68 days late on March 11, 2025.

3 The Respondent filed its amended L-6 report 130 days late on May 12, 2025. The amended report included required information missing from the original L-6 report, specifically the date the digital advertisements and billboards were launched (January1, 2025).

IV. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A RCW, the state campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
- 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.640(2)(a)(i)(A), and WAC 390-20-125, Respondent failed to register and report a grassroots lobbying campaign within 24 hours of the initial presentation to the public when the campaign occurred during the period beginning 30 days before the regular legislative session through the end of that session. The Respondent further failed to timely report the date the campaign was first presented to the public.
- 3. Mitigating factors in this case are: L-2 Lobbyist Monthly Expendiure Reports are due the 14th of the month following the activity. Monthly L-2 reports for Tobacco-Free Action Fund were filed by lobbyist Andrew Estep, working for lobbyist employer Cedar Strategies, LLC. The February, March, and April, 2025, L-2 reports were timely filed. The May, 2025, L-2 report was filed five days late.
- 4. Aggravating factors in this case are: L-2 reports filed on behalf of Tobacco-Free Action Fund by Cedar Strategies, LLC, covering the months of February, March, April and May, 2025, detailed expenses of \$255,379.58 in February, \$553,750 in March, \$201,875 in April, and \$10,000 in May. In total, Respondent reported close to \$1.31 million on direct and indirect lobbying during the 2025 legislative session. The Respondent has been registered with the PDC since at least 2019.

V. ORDER 1 2 Based upon the stipulated Findings of Fact and the Commission's Conclusions of Law, and the argument and testimony of the parties, the Commission accepts the agreed Stipulation 3 of the parties as to Facts, Violations, and Penalties and orders that: 4 5 1. The Respondent pay an aggregate civil penalty for the combined violations of 6 \$5,000, with \$2,500 suspended, on the following conditions: 7 8 The non-suspended portion of the penalty (\$2,500 of the \$5,000 total 9 a. monetary penalty) is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date 10 of the Final Order. 11 12 The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting 13 b. requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations 14 15 of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based 16 17 solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction. 18 19 2. If the Respondent fails to satisfy the conditions of Section V(1) of this order, the 20 suspended portion of the penalty shall immediately become due, and the matter 21 may be sent to collections or enforced in Superior Court as allowed by law 22 without further action by the Commission. 23 24 25 /// 26
