RECONSIDERATION

14 This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission
15 (Commission) on September 25, 2025, by in-person, telephonic and online streaming access.
16 Respondent Andrew Davis requested review on July 25, 2025, of the Presiding Officer's Order
17 entered on July 22, 2025, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing on June 25, 2025. The hearing
18 was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

19 Commissioners present in person were J. Robert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding),
20 Commission Vice Chair Douglass North, and Commissioner James Oswald. Also present in
21 person were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant
22 Attorney General Susie Giles-Klein representing PDC staff, and Alice Fiman, PDC Compliance
23 Officer. Notice was provided to the Respondent and he appeared on his own behalf. The
24 proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

1 The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- 2 1. Case memorandum dated September 16, 2025, prepared by Shelley Hines, PDC
3 Compliance Officer;
- 4 2. Brief Adjudicative Proceeding hearing notice, undated;
- 5 3. Initial Order Imposing Fine, entered July 22, 2025;
- 6 4. Respondent's email request for appeal, undated;
- 7 5. Review Hearing Notice for Case No. 173262, dated September 5, 2025.

9 **I. FINDINGS OF FACT**

10 The matter involved Respondent's request for the Commission to reconsider an Initial
11 Order entered on July 22, 2025, resulting from an Initial Hearing on June 25, 2025, regarding
12 Andrew Davis, a candidate for City Council Member for the City of Steilacoom in the 2025
13 election cycle. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent
14 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1)
15 covering the twelve months preceding his candidacy that was due within two weeks of his filing
16 as a candidate or no later than May 23, 2025. The Respondent has no prior violations with the
17 PDC.

19 1. On May 29, 2025, PDC staff emailed Respondent a hearing notice regarding the
20 missing F-1 report. The report was sent to the Respondent's email address of
21 record.
- 22
23 2. On June 7, 2025, the Respondent filed the F-1 report.
- 24
25 3. A Brief Enforcement Hearing was held July 22, 2025, where the Respondent was

1 found to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 due to failure to file an F-1 statement
2 within two weeks of becoming a candidate, or no later than May 23, 2025. The
3 Presiding Officer imposed a \$150 civil penalty, with \$25 suspended, consistent
4 with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule adopted
5 by the Commission.

7 4. On July 22, 2025, PDC staff served Respondent an Initial Order by email to the
8 Respondent's email address of record.
9

10 5. On July 25, 2025, Respondent contacted the PDC by email requesting to appeal
11 the penalty assessed in the Initial Order entered July 22, 2025. Respondent
12 stated the grounds for appeal were he was a first time filer and unaware of the
13 filing requirements, earlier notices from the PDC went to his junk mail folder,
14 and he had filed the report as soon as he received notice.
15

16 6. On September 16, 2025, PDC staff served Respondent a hearing notice by email
17 for a September 25, 2025, Hearing on Reconsideration before the Commission,
18 along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely.
19

20 21 **II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

22 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
23 42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
24 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
