1 2 3 4 5 6 7 BEFORE THE PUBLIC DISCLOSURE COMMISSION 8 OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON 9 In Re: The Matter of Enforcement Action PDC CASE NO. 175154 Against: 10 FINAL ORDER ON RECONSIDERATION 11 EZIQUIEL MORFIN, 12 Respondent. 13 14 This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission 15 (Commission) on September 25, 2025, by in-person, telephonic and online streaming access. 16 Respondent Eziquiel Morfin requested review on September 4, 2025, of the Presiding Officer's 17 Order entered on August 20, 2025, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing on August 7, 2025. 18 The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 19 WAC. 20 Commissioners present in person were J. Robert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding), 21 Commission Vice Chair Douglass North, and Commissioner James Oswald. Also present in 22 person were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant 23 Attorney General Susie Giles-Klein representing PDC staff, and Alice Fiman, PDC Compliance 24 Manager. Notice was provided to the Respondent and he appeared on his own behalf. The 25

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proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated September 12, 2025, prepared by Colin Peeples, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Brief Adjudicative Proceeding hearing notice, undated;
- 3. Initial Order Imposing Fine, entered August 20, 2025;
- 4. Respondent's email request for appeal, undated;
- 5. Review Hearing Notice for Case No. 175154, dated September 5, 2025.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involved Respondent's request for the Commission to reconsider an Initial Order entered on August 20, 2025, resulting from an Initial Hearing on August 7, 2025, regarding Eziquiel Morfin, an appointed member of the City of Toppenish City Council. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1) for the calendar year 2024, that was due no later than April 15, 2025.

- 1. Between March 14, and April 25, 2025, PDC staff sent email reminders to all registered candidates regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2024.
- 2. On May 5, 2025, PDC staff emailed a warning letter to the Respondent regarding his missing F-1 report.
- 3. On July 7, 2025, PDC staff emailed Respondent a hearing notice regarding the missing report. This hearing notice was sent to Respondent's email address of

3	4.	A Brief Enforcement Hearing was held August 7, 2025, where the Respondent
4	''	was found to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 due to failure to file an F-1
5		statement for calendar year 2024, no later than April 15, 2025. The Presiding
6		Officer imposed a \$500 civil penalty, with \$200 suspended, consistent with WAC
7		390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule adopted by the
8		Commission.

10	5.	On August 20, 2025, PDC staff served Respondent an Initial Order by email to

23		II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
24	1.	The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
25		42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
26		RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
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2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an appointed official is required to file an F-1 statement no later than April 15, 2025, for calendar year 2024.

III. ORDER

This Order on Reconsideration will be the Final Order. After reconsideration of the facts of this case and the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Initial Hearing Order finding the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is MODIFIED. The Respondent is found to be in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and is assessed a civil penalty of \$500, with \$500 suspended, on the following conditions:

- 1. a. The missing F-1 statement due for calendar year 2024 is filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
 - b. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
- 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar year 2024 shall immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection
